

### CITY TAXES.

An Ordinance To Raise Supplies For The Year of Our Lord, 1909.

Be it ordsined, by the Mayor and Aldermen of the city of Camden, S. G., and by the authority of the same, that the fol-lowing taxes be and the same are hereby levied for the current year from the 1st Jay of January 1909, to the Sist day of December, 1909.

A tax of ten (10) mills on each and every dellar of real and personal property within the corporate limits of the City of 10 15 a m Camden, 8, C., on the first day of January Sec. 1. That all able bodied male per

7 30 p m 10 32 a m sons between the ages of eighteen and 11 10 a m (fifty years, residing within the corporate limits of the city of Camdes, S. C., not exempt from road duty under the laws of the State, shall work the streets, ways and bridges under the direction of such overseers as may be appointed for such a space of time not exceeding six (6) days in one year. Provided: That at the days in one year. Provided: That at the time of receiving the notice any person may pay to the person glying such notice three dollars (\$3.60) commutation, which shall be received in lieu of the work, and that any person refusing to mark said stream or to mark and servers and stream or to mark and servers and stream or to mark and servers a work said streets or to pay said com-mutation, shall be fined not less than five (\$5 00) dollars nor more than ten (\$10 00) dollars or be imprisoned not less than ten (10) days nor more than twenty (20) days, in the discretion of the city Recorder.
