

thorize the deposit of the receipts of the postal banks in National and State banks and their investment in Covernment securities, and in bonds of States and municipalities which have the taxing power; but a reserve fand of five per cent. of the total de-posits shall be kept in the Treasury at all times. Investment in indemnity bonds is prohibited. The trustees and authorized at any time to devote forty-seven per cent. of the funds of the postal banks to the redemption of Federal bonds or to the purchase of bonds of any new issue. An entirely new provision requires that all new landes of United States bondy, for refunding or a new loan, shall be in denominations of \$24 and multiples thereof.
