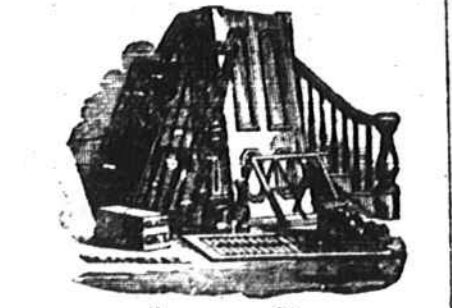

Clemson Agricultural College Examination.

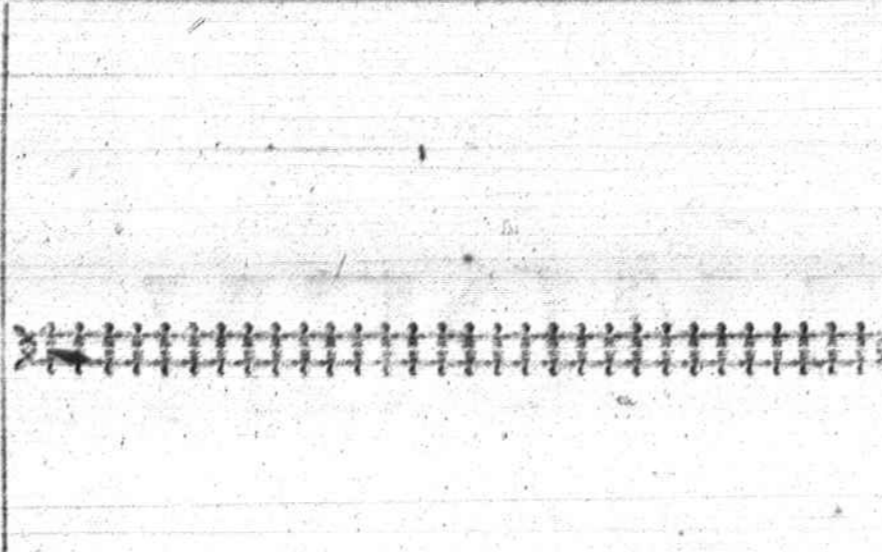
The examination for the award of scholarships in Clemson Agricultural College will be held in the County Court House on Friday, July 29th, at 9 a. m. Applicants must fill out proper forms to be secured from the County Superintendent of Education, but they will be allowed to stand the examination. For detailed information, apply to the Superintendent of Education, or to the President of Clemson College. Applicants for admission to the College, but not seeking for the scholarships, will also stand entrance examinations at the Court House July 29th.

The scholarships are worth \$100 and free tuition. The next session of the college opens September 14th, 1910.

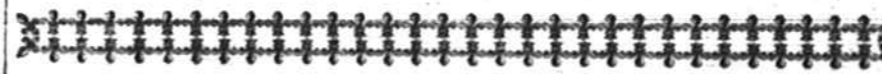

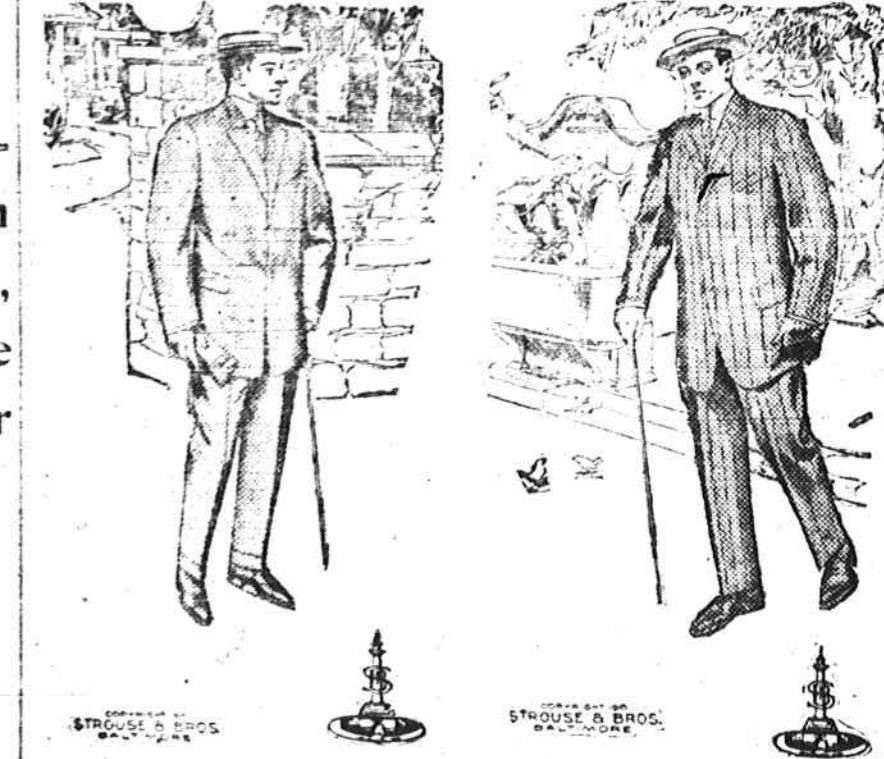
