Railroad Commission Wishes to Know Status of Northwestern Road.

The following appeared in the Columbia Record of last Monday: The question of whether or not the Northwestern Railroad of South Carolina and the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad Company are under the same ownership will be brought by the railroad commission to a hearing to be held in Columbia on May 5.

Should it be shown that the two roads are jointly owned the continuous mileage base will be ordered by the commission. This was done in the case of the Charleston & Western Carolina and in the case of the Chesterfield & Lancaster and the Seaboard.

ORDINANCE.

SPECIAL LICENSE.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Camden, S. C., and by the authority of the same: Sec. 1. That this Special License Ordinance adopted by the City of Camden on the 3rd day of April, 1911, for the present fiscal year, and passed and ordained as a special ordinance to raise supplies for the fiscal year ending April 30th, 1912. That every person, firm or corporation, engaged or intending to engage in any trade, business or profession hereafter mentioned, within the limits of the City of Camden, shall first obtain a license from the Clerk and Treasurer and all license herein mentioned shall be non-transferable and for the fiscal year if not otherwise specially provided.

Table listing various licenses and their costs: Clerk and Treasurer, all fees for same shall be paid to him in advance. Sec. 2. Any person, firm or corporation shall be required to prosecute or carry on any business, occupation or profession, hereinafter mentioned without first receiving from the Clerk and Treasurer of the City, a special license therefor.
