Miss Katherine Chappell, of Lykesland, Richland County, South Carolina, was sent as demonstration agent and has rendered most excellent service. The work was started too late in the year for best results, and weather conditions during the summer proved so unfavorable that somewhat more than half of the members became discouraged and gave up the effort to make a crop. Those who have continued to the end have done remarkably well under the circumstances. Some of them, in spite of the late start and the unfavorable weather, have attained really wonderful results. It has been decided to hold a Girls' Tomato Club exhibit in con-nection with the County Fair. Those girls who have kept up the work as members of the club to the end will be admitted free to the entire Fair. They can get badges from Mr. McKenzie on the opening day of the Fair.
