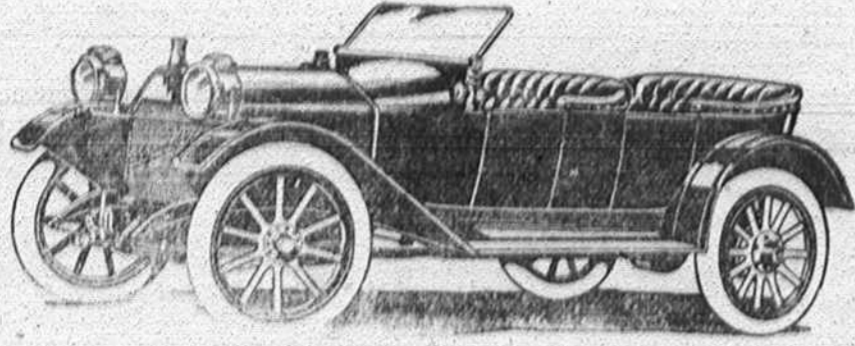


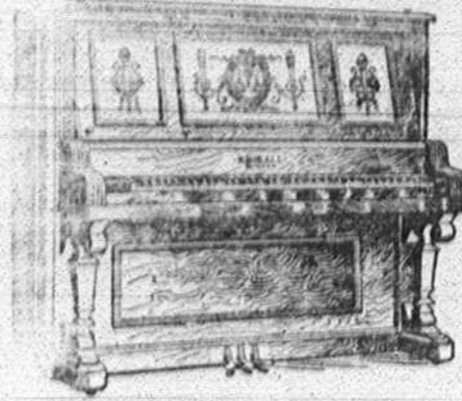

"Opportunity Time" Closes Next Wednesday

About "Opportunity Time"

Under the terms of this offer ("Opportunity Time") every club of \$10 worth of subscriptions turned in by 8 p. m., Wednesday, January 8th, will entitle the contestant sending them in to an extra ballot of 25,000 votes, over and above the regular schedule.

The subscriptions may be either old or new—anything from one to ten years. Old subscriptions count the same as new (see part of this ad on right side of page under TO THE CANDIDATES), and each \$10 worth will be called a club and an EXTRA ballot good for 25,000 votes will be issued on each club.

Subscriptions that have already been secured for a period of one and two years may be extended. The full scale of regular votes will be allowed on all such extensions. When such orders are secured they should be marked "extension" across the face of the stub turned in to the office.

No Limit to Number of Clubs.

There is no limit to the number of clubs that may be turned in by any one candidate. Each candidate who hopes to be numbered among the prize winners should at least turn in one club.

Time Extended.

When "Opportunity Time" was first announced, just before Christmas, the contest management did not take into consideration the fact that during the holidays little or no time would be given up to the contest affairs and consequently nothing has been accomplished by the contestants during the present offer of 25,000 extra votes on every club of \$10 worth of subscriptions.

Many of the candidates have suggested to the contest manager that an extension of time be made in which to secure a club to earn the 25,000 extra vote ballot. This request has been granted and the offer will be open until Wednesday January 8th, at 8 o'clock in the evening, instead of Saturday night as was originally announced. There will be no other changes from this announcement. "Opportunity Time" will positively close next Wednesday night.

THE CANDIDATES AND HOW THEY STAND.

Until further notice no candidate will be allowed to cast for publication more subscriptions than will place her total more than 5,000 votes ahead of the leader of the last publication. For example, the leader today has 1,000 votes, and any candidate may publish enough votes for the next issue of the paper to make her total reach 12,000 votes. Candidates may turn in as many subscriptions as they wish but the publishing of votes will be limited by the above ruling. This ruling will apply, however, only to the city vote coupons. Candidates may cast for publication as many of these as they can secure, provided they are sent to The Chronicle office before the expiration date printed on each city vote coupon. This rule, limiting the casting of votes, will be removed later in the contest.

In another part of The Chronicle today will be found an announcement of great interest to you as well as the people over Kershaw county generally.
