All able bodied male persons from the age of twenty-one (21) to sixty (60) years, both inclusive, except residents of the incorporated towns of the county, shall pay two dollars (\$2) as a road tax, except ministers of the gospel actually in charge of a congregation, teachers employed in public schools, school trustees and persons permanently disabled in the military service of this state, and persons who served in the late war between the States, and all persons actually employed in the quarantine service of this state, and all students who may be attending school or college at the time when the said road tax shall become due. Persons claiming disabilities must present certificates from two reputable physicians of this county.
