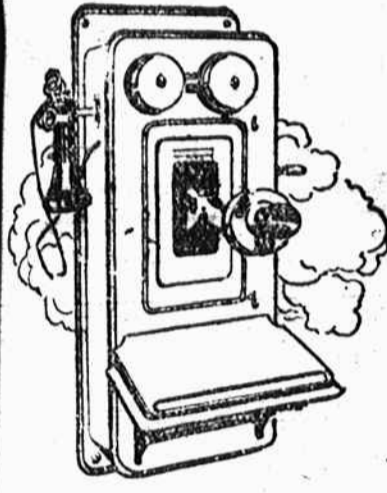
James B. Baker of South Carolina is secretary of the Senate. He is a graduate of law from the University and was librarian of the Senate for some time before being elected a secretary.
