

Washington, May 26 .- Total subscrip tions to the fifth, or victory liberty loan, were announced today by the treasury as \$5,249,908,300, an oversubscription of nearly \$750,000,000. It was estimata ed officially today that there were 12,-000,000 subscribers to the loan. Nearly 60 per cent of the total \$2,663,154,850 was taken in subscriptions of \$10,000 or less.


