### Taken to Penitentiary.

Altamont Murray, a Lee county negro, was taken to Columbia Tuesday and placed in the penitentiary for safe keeping until the next term of court. Murray was arrested Monday under a warrant issued by Magistrate L. S. Vinson, of Rembert, charging him with assault and carrying a pistol, the arrest being made by deputy Sheriff H. G. McKagen and Rural Policemen H. B. Boykin and Alex Norris. He was committed to jail, but the aggravated nature of his offense having given rise to considerable feeling, it was thought advisable to place him in the penitentiary until he is brought to trial at the next term of court.

It is stated that some days ago Murray and several other negroes were congregated in the road in the Hagood section and that a lady who was driving a car passed them, and in doing so the fender of the car brushed Murray, but did not injure him at all. Murray drew a pistol and threatened to shoot her, when she stopped to ascertain if he had been hurt. He demanded that he be paid five dollars as satisfaction and was rude and threatening in language and manner. It is also stated that Murray was himself responsible for the car striking him as he had ample time to get out of the road, but did not do so.—Sumter Item.

Washington, May 26.—Total subscriptions to the fifth, or victory liberty loan, were announced today by the treasury as \$5,249,908,300, an oversubscription of nearly \$750,000,000. It was estimated officially today that there were 12,000,000 subscribers to the loan. Nearly 60 per cent of the total \$2,663,154,850 was taken in subscriptions of \$10,000 or less.

### BOARDS DISCHARGED.

#### Selective Service Boards Receive Letter of Thanks From General Crowder.

The selective service board of Kershaw County who had charge of selecting the men for military duty in this county has received the following letter of dismissal and thanks from Provost General Crowder:

Washington, April 6, 1919:

To Members of all Selective Service Boards:

The President has directed that all Boards of the Selective Service System be discontinued; that all members thereof be honorably relieved from the duties of their respective offices effective March 31, 1919; and that a Certificate of Service be issued to members relieved from duty by the order mentioned. A copy of this order is enclosed. A suitable certificate of service, countersigned by the Governor of your State, will be transmitted to you at a later date.

The Selective Service organization is dissolved. This is my last official communication to its members. Two years ago today, the Congress declared a state of war to exist with the Imperial German Government. America's army was but a handful. The plan to raise it to the proper strength was inchoate and uncertain. Today the war is won and an army of four million is already half demobilized.

You have performed a stupendous task, you have performed it loyally and well. But you have done more. You have the ground work for a new ideal in democracy. You have taught and shown the value and the possibilities of sympathetic and understanding co-operation. You have discovered and vindicated a new altruism, you have crystallized an ideal and made of it a system.

In these closing words, I add my heartfelt praise to the grateful thanks of America.

him by the Act of Congress to authorize the President to increase temporarily the Military Establishment of the United States, approved May 18, 1917, the President hereby directs that all District, Local, Medical Advisory, and Legal Advisory Boards in the Selective Service Organization be discontinued; that all members of these boards be honorably relieved from the duties of their respective offices effective March 31, 1919, and that a certificate of service rendered on said boards be issued to all members thereof who are relieved from duty by this order.
