

Camden Wholesale Grocery Distributors for Camden Nurses For Influenza.

As has been stated before and has been especially emphasized, the Division Office is not able to supply Red Cross nurses in time of epidemics except to do community nursing, and then not as long as communities are not doing what they can for themselves and making use of all of their own available nursing resources. Nurses who have registered for epidemic service are not to be used for private cases, and no town which has a number of nurses on private duty should expect some other town to furnish it with other nurses for epidemic duty, when that means that these nurses must be given away from 'what they are doing. This can be done only in case of a real emergency when the Division office is convinced by thorough investigation that the need of the first town is much worse and more immediate than that of the town from which the nurses are summoned.

The Division Department of Nursing is doing all in its power to help communitles meet the problems of adequate nursing service that are coming up in these days of increasing epidemic, but the Division is practically helpless unless the communities learn to help themselves and each other. As long as the towns are not making real and effective use of the nurses which they already have, they should not expect other nurses to be sent to them from outside. In many cases they are expecting the nurses to do what members of the patients' families ought to be doing, especially those members who have taken the Red Cross course in Home Hygiene and Care of the Sick, instead of conserving their strength for the supervision of the nursing service of the entire community. This failure on the part of towns to utilize the resources within themselves instead of calling for outside aid is making a much more serious situation out of the present epidemic than is necessary because of actual conditions. This does not mean that the Division office will not help these towns where an actual emergency exists, but simply that it in turn expects the very best cooperation from the towns themselves in order to make the service effective for the whole Division and not for a few people or even for a few towns.

Washington, March 2.—Acting on the recommendation of the new Secretary of Agriculture, the Senate agriculture committee today voted to eliminate from the annual agricultural bill the \$240,-000 voted by the House to continue the time-hallowed custom of distribution of free seeds to the constituents by members of congress.


