Enemy Trophies To Go To Staes.
South Carolina will get 1.42 per cent of the vast store of captured German field pieces, machine guns, rifles and other arms which are to be distributed by the war department soon. Practically every member of congress has introduced bills asking that some of these war souvenirs be sent to the important municipalities and communities in their home districts.

A vast store of these arms is now in the country ready to be packed and shipped to all parts of the country as soon as congress passes the required legislation according to a report which has just been prepared by the war department. Included in this collection are: 3,242 cannons and big guns, including French mortars from the 77 millimeter guns up to the 240 and 245 millimeter howitzers. Of these the service will retain all but 1,800. There are from 10,000 to 12,000 machine guns and 72,000 rifles, according to the report.

The vast quantity of enemy arms is now in storage at Fort Newark, N. J., and represents perhaps the most complete collection of enemy arms in the entire world, including, as it does, cannon, mortars, small arms and other implements of every type used by Germans, Turks, Austrians and Bulgars in the war.
