Declaration and Petition for Charter.

State of South Carolina, County of Kershaw.

To the Secretary of State: The undersigned petitioners T. W. Starnes, president; W. D. Grigsby, vice president; T. J. Ross, secretary and treasurer; all of Blaney, S. C., by this declaration are as above given. The name of the proposed corporation which they desire to form is Blaney Cotton Warehouse Co. The place at which it proposes to have its principal place of business, or to be located is Blaney, S. C. The general nature of the business which it proposes to do is for storing cotton and other products. The amount of the capital stock to be \$2,000, payable within thirty days. The number of shares in which the capital stock is to be divided is 80, of the par value of \$25 each. Wherefore, your petitioners pray that the Secretary of State do issue to them a commission authorizing them

Teache's Examination.

The fall teacher's examination will be held in the court house at Camden Friday, October 1st, 1920. This is the first examination to be held under the new law requiring the State Board of Examiners to grade all papers and certificate all applicants who pass. The Board of Examiners will require every teacher to have a certificate either by examination, or by diploma. In view of this all teachers are urged to see whether they have a valid certificate.
