The first witness that came before the coroner's jury and, according to his testimony and the testimony of other witnesses he was the first to find the dead body of Mr. McLemore. He stated that he unlocked the door to Mr. Calk's office at about 8:30 Monday morning and found a man lying on the floor well covered with a dark-colored overcoat. The janitor said that he did not know who it was, but that he had noticed "Wake up and tell your dreams," thinking the man asleep. Noticing how still the figure was, he stated, he walked over and shook him by the shoulder. He then noticed that the figure was stiff, so went over to Mr. Cooper's office, which adjoins the office occupied by Mr. Calk, and brought Mr. Cooper back with him. Mr. Cooper recognized the man as being Mr. McLemore and exclaimed: "It's Lucian McLemore." Officer Carrigan, who was standing on the corner of Main and Liberty streets, was called into the office next.

Mr. J. H. Clifton, who was next called as a witness, said that he had started to go to his home at about 6 o'clock Sunday afternoon and was at the transfer stand at the corner of Main and Liberty streets when he saw Calk standing at a window in his office. Said that he went up just to talk to Calk and that he had talked with him for possibly two or three hours. Said Al Keels then came up and that the three had talked. Al had brought a small quantity of whiskey along. Said that they were on the verge of breaking up and going home when McLemore came into the room. This was the first time Clifton had seen McLemore in a month to talk to him. Clifton stated that McLemore seemed in an unusually good frame of mind and absolutely sober. One bottle of whiskey that Keels had brought along was upended in the room. Clifton says that he is positive that McLemore did not take a drink while in the room. After a time McLemore got out of his chair and laid down on the floor, still talking as he laid on the floor. Mr. Clifton stated to the jury that he had seen McLemore lay down on the floor a number of times as he did on Sunday night. Said he thought it nothing unusual. McLemore did not complain of feeling badly. He was laughing and joking the whole time. Said that he tried to get McLemore to get up and come home several times, McLemore had refused. Mr. Clifton does not remember about the extra overcoat. He remembered that Mr. McLemore had on his own overcoat, but does not remember a thing about the extra overcoat. Mr. Clifton said that he and Keels left for home some time after 11 o'clock on Sunday night, leaving McLemore in the office. He was never more surprised when told of McLemore's death at about 11 o'clock Monday morning.

There being no other evidence obtainable the jury returned the verdict that L. W. McLemore died in the city of Sumter, December 6, from causes unknown to this jury.

Mr. McLemore had been living here for the last ten or twelve years, coming here from Florence. He was the attorney for the Atlantic Coast Line and his colleagues speak of him as a very brilliant attorney. Mrs. McLemore, who was at the time visiting in Augusta, was notified of his death and came over, returning with the body Tuesday evening to Augusta, which is their old home. Mr. McLemore was a man of about 40 years and besides his wife, is survived by five small children and one brother, who resides in Augusta. - Sumter Herald.

Edgar N. Halyburton, of Taylorville, N. C., who during the World War was a sergeant in Company E, Sixteenth Infantry, enjoys the unique distinction of having a Distinguished Service Medal awarded him for services performed while a prisoner in Germany. Sergeant Halyburton voluntarily took command of the different camps in which he was located and established administrative and personal headquarters for the benefit of American prisoners.

**HORRIBLE BUTCHERY**  
**Amos Jennings Killed by Unknown Person.**

Amos Jennings, negro living near DuBose's Spring, 10 miles from Sumter, was found dead early Sunday morning by his wife, with his head mangled, skull chopped open and his face cut beyond recognition. According to the testimony before Coroner Settle yesterday of Lucinda Jennings the wife of the dead negro he had left home at about 8 o'clock on Saturday night and did not tell her where he was going, only saying that he had promised to take a man somewhere and left the place in his buggy. His wife stated that he did not return so she got up early Sunday morning to look for him and seeing his mule hitched to the buggy under the shed she went out to the shed and found her husband lying face down in the foot of the buggy in a pool of blood. His feet were resting on the front buggy axle.

The body was examined by Dr. W. S. Burgess, who stated that the negro had come to his death from blows on his head from some heavy instrument with a sharp point.

The negro's lap robe was found about 3 miles down the road from the negro's house.

No clues have been left by the barbaric murderers, but it is hoped that something tangible will be gotten hold of later. Sheriff Hurst, Deputy Sheriff McKagen and Rural Officer Boykin spent the entire day yesterday searching houses and barns in the neighborhood and working on the case.

The place of the murder is unknown and the weapons used cannot be found. It is not known whether the mule brought the dead negro home or if he was driven to his very door by his assassin. Fresh buggy tracks where another buggy turned around several times in the road were found near the house. Just now this crime is enshrouded in mystery. - Sumter Item.

**AN ORDINANCE**

Giving the right of way on the streets of the city of Camden to the fire trucks in case of an alarm of fire; and providing for protection of fire hose.

City Council  
Camden S. C., Dec. 6, 1920.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Camden, S. C. in due session assembled the 6th day of December, 1920:

Section 1. Whenever there is an alarm of fire in the city of Camden, all motor vehicles of every description, all horse drawn vehicles of every description, and all pedestrians shall give the right of way on the streets, or any public places of the city of Camden to the fire trucks. That all vehicles of every description shall immediately upon the alarm of fire being sounded drive at once, as near as possible to the curb upon whichever side of the street said vehicle happens to be going, and all vehicles shall remain stationary until the fire truck, or trucks said have passed.

Section 2. That no one shall drive any vehicle over any fire hose of the city of Camden.

Section 3. That all persons violating the provision of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in a sum not exceeding One Hundred Dollars, or imprisonment for a period not exceeding thirty days, at the discretion of the Recorder of the City of Camden. And that said imprisonment may be accompanied with the additional requirement of hard labor upon streets of the said city.

Ratified in Council assembled this 6th day of February, 1920.

**ATTORNEY DIES SUDDENLY**  
Coroner's Jury Says He Came To His Death From Causes Unknown.

Mr. Lucian W. McLemore, one of the attorneys of the Sumter bar, was found dead in the office of Mr. James Calk in the National Bank of Sumter building at about 8:30 o'clock Monday morning by Joe McCoy the negro janitor of the building. As soon as the janitor found the body he at once summoned Mr. J. C. Cooper, who occupies offices on the same floor. Dr. Archie China was called in and made a superficial examination of the body and stated that in his opinion Mr. McLemore had been dead about six hours.

Monday afternoon the coroner empaneled a jury to investigate the cause of Mr. McLemore's death. Joe McCoy, the negro janitor, was
