

**ANOTHER SKELETON FOUND**  
Georgia "Death Farm" Continues to Give Up Dead.

An aftermath of the John S. Williams "murder farm" case developed last week when it was learned that another skeleton had been discovered, in a pond a short distance from the Williams home in Jasper county, Georgia. This discovery brought the number of bodies recovered as a result of the killings to thirteen.

While the skeleton was found several days ago when the waters of the pond had receded and left the bones near the bank, the discovery was not made public until tonight. Jasper county officials stated it was impossible to identify the skeleton, but they believe it to be that of one of the negroes alleged to have been killed by Williams' sons, Marvin, Leroy and Hulan Williams, now under indictments for murder, but have been missing since a short time after the first bodies were

found on the Williams farm. John S. Williams is now in the full county jail where he is serving a life sentence, having been convicted in Newton superior court for the murder of one of his employees, Clyde Manning, negro farm boss, who confessed that he aided Williams in a number of the murders, and who pointed out the graves of the victims, also is serving a life sentence.

**MORE POWER PLANTS**

To Be Constructed By Southern Power Company.

Charlotte, N. C. Nov. 14.—The immediate construction of two new hydro-electric power plants with a combined maximum generating capacity of 140,000 horse power is planned by the Southern Power company of this city, according to announcement by officials of this company this afternoon.

The new plant which will be completed first will be a new power house immediately adjacent to the present power station at Great Falls. It will be known as Great Falls No. 2 and will have a maximum capacity of 60,000 horse power, having three generating units of 20,000 horse power each. No additional dam will be required for this station and it is anticipated that this plant can be erected in about 12 months.

The second new power station will be at Mountain Island on the Catawba river just above Mt. Holly. This is the site of the old Mountain Island Cotton mill which was utterly destroyed and swept away in the great flood of 1916. This has long been regarded as an ideal location for a large power plant, having an available head of approximately 80 feet. The Mountain Island plant will have four generating units of 20,000 horse power each, developing a maximum of 80,000 horse power.
