Kershaw County Extension Service. (By Miss Blanche Tarrant.) A new Woman's Home Demonstration Club was recently organized in the Lugoff Community. The ladies assembled at the home of Mrs. Hugh McCallum and requested the Home Demonstration Agent to come that they might form a club. The charter members of club being: Mrs. J. A. Bell, Mrs. James Team, Mrs. N. P. Gettys, Mrs. J. T. Gettys, Mrs. J. A. Roseboro, Mrs. E. T. Truesdale, Mrs. Hugh McCallum, Mrs. D. C. Blackman, Miss Mary Roseboro, Mrs. B. W. Gettys and Mrs. J. L. Gettys. Cooking clubs are organized at the Canteen and McLeod Schools for the girls.

Sewing Clubs among the girls are organized at Lugoff, Pine Grove, and Cleveland Schools.

Poultry Clubs for Boys and Girls are organized at Bethel, Lugoff, and Pine Grove School.

Other schools will be visited in the near future.

Profit in Poultry. Girls and boys in the Home Demonstration clubs of South Carolina are making their own money by means of poultry, canning and similar ways.

Arion B. Smith, of the Millers' Club, in Marlboro County, made a clear profit of \$65.00 on his flock of Barred Rocks. Alton sold 10 settings of eggs at \$2.50 each, besides selling some of his best fowls.

Olive H. Moody, of the Bermuda Poultry Club of Dillon county reports a profit of \$112.25 on her flock of Orpingtons. Besides selling eggs and chickens, the family table was kept supplied with poultry products.

Thelma Miller, a 12-year-old member of the Poplar Springs poultry club of Spartanburg County, purchased a pen of pure bred Barred Rocks, set pure bred eggs and raised a total of 74 birds. Thelma sold 14 dozen eggs, 21 fowls, won four prizes at the County Fair, and has a yard full of fine birds to begin the new year's work. Her profit for last year, after deducting expenses, amounted to \$98.05.

Geneva Langford, a Richland County poultry club member living at Blythe-wood, raised White Rocks. Her sales from fowls and eggs amounted to \$120.85. Geneva won \$10.00 in prizes on her best birds at the Fair. A flock of about 75 birds is in the yard for beginning another year of successful work.

These are only a few of the many splendid records made by poultry club members last year.
