

Catawba Has Plenty Water.
On last Wednesday morning at 6 o'clock the water at Mountain Island began for the first time to run over the spillway at the big dam. Owing to recent rains in Western North Carolina, the Catawba has been flushed more than at any time since the dam was begun. Now the water is eighty-five feet high and is pouring in torrents over the dam. The big lake is now covering thousands of acres of land and is backed up the Catawba more than twelve miles. The entire power plant is running full force and developing eighty thousand horse power. Visitors are flocking to Mountain Island from far and near to see for the first time the finished lake. They are allowed to see through the power house on week days. Many are taking advantage of this privilege—Mount Holly, N. C., Citizen.
