The General Gas & Electric Corporation recently formed the Broad River Power Company to provide for the future electric power require-ments of Columbia, Spartanburg and adjacent towns.

Mr. Barstow was very enthusiastic in discussing the prospects he had noted for the prosperity, growth and development of the Southern cities which he visited, especially those in which the companies he represents have interests. He stated that these companies can be counted upon to help along the progress and expansion of the cities by developing their public utility services to the highest

possible stage of efficiency.

Halsey, Stuart & Co., Inc., and
Pynchon & Co., investment bankers
of Chicago and New York, have purchased the first bond issue of \$1,500,-000 of the Broad River Power Company, the entire proceeds of which will be used to carry into effect the initial phases of the construction and extension program. Their decision to do so was based largely on the wide diversification of essential industries using electric power already located in and near Columbia and Spartanburg.

While a part of the territory in which the Broad River Power Company will operate already supports a large amount of industrial activity, all of the territory holds great potential opportunities," said Mr. Barstow. "A real scarcity of power during the past three years has made it necessary for the power companies to refuse new power business to large companies in some instances. Despite this situation, however, I found that quite steady and satisfactory growth of both the electric light and power and gas business.
