MITTLE RECEIVES FREEDOM

Was Serving Nine-Year Term for State of South Carolina Manslaughter

Columbia, Nov. 25,-Edward N. Mittle, convicted in Orangeburg county of manslaughter and sentenced to nine years in prison, was today Mamie E. Smith, Defendant freed from the state penitentiary by action of Governor McLeod.

The sentence was commuted to four and one-half years to make it conform with the indeterminate sentences act of the 1925 legislature, and the unserved portion was suspended. Mittle had served three years and three months
