Chain Store Tax Is Again Upheld

Washington, Nov. 30 .- For the third time in the year, chain stores today received bad news from the Supreme court-this time in a decision upholding the Virginia tax an warehouses which distribute to more than one store.

Lawyers of the Great Atlantic and Pacific company argued their case was different from those decided by the court in approving Indiana and North Carolina chain store taxes.

The court did not think so, however. Chief Justice Hughes, in announcing that the decree of a lower court which upheld the tax was affirmed, explained that the suit was governed by the court's action in the previous cases. There was no written opinion.

The first of these cases to be passed upon, that of Indiana, is preedent now, but it was decided by the narrowest possible margin, 5 to




