ADVERTISEMENT FOR BIDS

The Town Council of the Town of Camden, S. C., Mrs. Louise W. Boykin, Clerk and Treasurer, will receive sealed bids for the construction of Sanitary Sewerage Extensions and Sewage Pumping Station until 5 P. M., E. S. T., on Tuesday, the 4th day of March, 1947, at the Town Hall, Camden, S. C., at which time and place all bids will be publicly opened and read aloud.

This project is divided into two sections as indicated:

SECTION 1. Consists of approximately 9,276 feet of 18" sewers, 21 manholes and appurtenances.

SECTION 11. Consists of one Sewage Pumping Station without pumps.

The contract will be awarded to the lowest combination of the two sections which, in the opinion of the Council, is to the best interest of the Town.

The successful bidder will be required to furnish satisfactory performance and payment bond or bonds.

Proposed forms of contract documents, including plans and specifications, are on file and may be examined at the office of the Council, Camden, S. C., or at the office of the Engineers.
