### Rev. J. V. Murray Home From Town, Country School

Rev. J. V. Murray, pastor of the Bethune Methodist church, was one of the representatives from South Carolina at the Town and Country School of Emory University, which was held June 5-22. There were 45 rural ministers of Southern states from Maryland to Texas present.

Others present from South Carolina in addition to Mr. Murray were James M. Barrington, Cope; Dr. F. C. Beach, Chester; Rev. C. W. Brockwell, Greenwood; Rev. B. S. Hughes, Lamar; and Rev. L. C. Turberville, Port Mill.

Courses given in the school were Rural Leadership, by Dr. Arthur Raper of the department of agriculture; the Rural Community by Dr. Mary Mims, extension sociologist of Louisiana State University; Human Relations by John C. Harmon of Lexington, N. C.; Music in the Rural Church by Rev. H. Vance Taylor of Atlanta, Ga., and Creative Writing by Rev. James M. Sells of Atlanta, Ga.

At a banquet for the school, Senator Richard B. Russell of Georgia, spoke. He emphasized the fight in Congress to private farmers with a greater proportionate share of the national income.

Significant recommendations were made in several courses such as longer tenures for rural ministers and a more nearly equalized income of rural and urban pastors.

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### Boll Weevils Are Still Very Active

Even with the hot, dry weather the boll weevils are doing damage in some fields, County Agent W. C. McCarley said Thursday.

"Farmers should protect the young bolls by dusting with Toxaphene or in the case of young cotton B. H. C. should be used," Mr. McCarley said. "Some of the older cotton is far enough advanced where the weevils do not hurt the bolls. In that case it is not recommended that this cotton be poisoned."

### Mrs. J. D. Gillis Is Hurt In Car Wreck

Mrs. J. D. Gillis, Rutledge street, suffered a fractured right arm, a broken nose and severe lacerations about the head when a car, driven by Mrs. T. Lee Myers, Mill street, skidded on the highway at the intersection of U. S. 74 and U. S. 521 two miles this side of Sumter last Friday and turned over.

Mrs. Myers, together with her three children, Thomas 8, Marion 3 and Stephen 2 months old, escaped with bruises and slight cuts.

Mrs. Myers, wife of Councilman T. L. Myers, was driving from Sumter to Camden. It was raining hard and the asphalt surface of the highway was unusually slick. There is a pronounced gradient at the fork in the highway and it was on this slope that the car started to skid.

All of the occupants of the car were taken to the Tuomy hospital in Sumter. Later Mrs. Gillis was removed to the Camden hospital. Mrs. Myers and children were able to return to their home.
