Dr. A. W. Humphries, county health officer, spoke to 175 Camden High School boys at a meeting sponsored by the Camden High School Future Farmers of America and the Camden Kiwanis Club Tuesday in the Camden Grammar School auditorium. The meeting was a part of the health program being sponsored by the FFA chapter and the Kiwanis Club.

Dr. Humphries explained the ill effects derived from diseases caught by boys during their care-free days. He warned the youths at the dangers of venereal diseases and of their effects in later life.
