Exports of corn from the United States to Europe last year exceeded two hundred million bushels, not counting barrels of meal, and the demand grows.

PUBLIC ROAD IMPROVEMENT.

(Continued from our last issue.) The engineer shall survey the highway to be built fixing needful specifications, as in Railway grading.

These improved roads should be a foot higher in the middle than at the edge, making natural water shed, edge at a drain.

The road should be wide enough for two vehicles to pass driven at rapid rate. The law should require the driver of each vehicle to keep upon his right hand side of the highway, under a penalty of ten dollars for first violation.

These improved highways should be covered with clay five or six inches and a slight sprinkling of sand following; over which immense rollers should pass packing the road firm.

One horse draws the load that now requires two and three. The wives and daughters of the farmers can drive their buggies to neighboring towns in comparatively short time compared with that now consumed in grinding through our miles of sand.

In proportion as we perfect our highways our farms become the scene of an auto-bellum days, when we find "there is life in the old land yet."

We make the home pleasanter. We diminish the prevailing malaria for town life, that is a scourge to many of our families to seek the town residence.

Briefly stated, we have first class turnpikes. The work to be let out by sections, thus placing these contracts in the hands of the farmers along the highways to be built.

The people have the use of the turnpike fifty years before the debt shall be fully paid. The money thus placed in circulation is had at a lower rate of interest than the private citizen can effect loans.
