THE CROP IS SHORT.

The National Ginner's Association cotton report made public on the 19th just shows a total of 7,411,359 bales ginned up to the 14th November. The estimates showed 84.7 per cent of the crop picked and 78 per cent ginned, indicating a total crop of 9,459,793 bales.

The report as to South Carolina shows 982,780 bales ginned, 84.3 per cent picked and the total crop of this State estimated at 999,997 bales.
