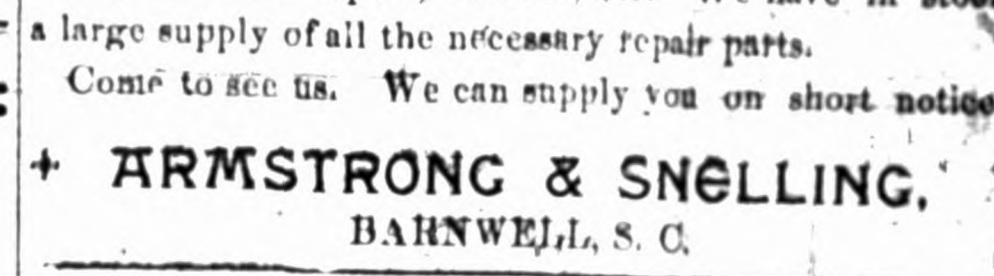

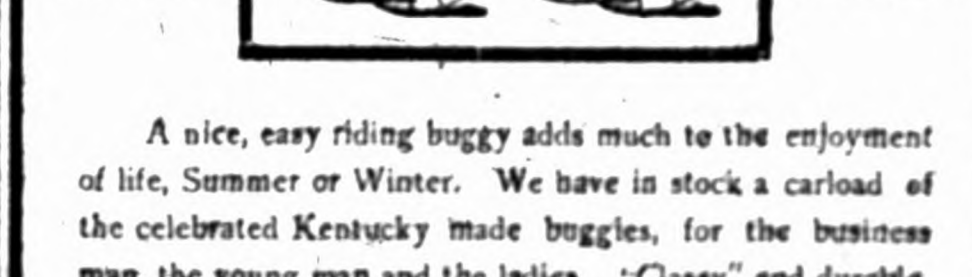
Negro Janitor Arrested for Fleeing Attempts.
