This revelation deprives Yello Jack of all his terrors in warm climates

Another discovery of greater value the finding out within the recent pas that vaccination with typhoid serum a sure preventive of that death sqourg of the temperate zones. Three year ago Brig. Gen. Torrey. Surgeon Gen eral of the United States, began the vaccination of troops with the typhoid serum. The result has been an unbroken saving in life and prevention

There are now, and have been for Frank H McKinney several months, 18,000 soldiers in camp in Toxas. All/there were vaccinate and only one case of typhold has de voloped and that was of a mild type.

For generations the efficiency of armies in the fields and garrisons i the fofts has been greatly weakened by typhoid and typhus fevers. This vac cination discovery promises not only Yarger life saving among the sons of battle, but in the homes of peace and marts of trade it will save much suffer ing and loss of life.

Typhoid is more a disease of a clay country, of the mountain valleys an crowded towns and cities than of th more porous sand soils nearer the sea There the vaccination treatment will be of far more general benefit in suc localities as have annual recurrence of typhoid, sometimes approaching epidemic proportions.
