PERSISTENT TO EDUCATION.

Friends of education throughout the county will be interested in some of the salient facts in the progress of educational affairs in Barnwell county.

The white enrollment was 2344; the negro enrollment 447. Comparing these figures with the previous year's report, I find a loss in the white enrollment, and 641 less enrolled in the negro schools, requiring the reason for this decrease in enrollment. I have been informed in several instances that the enormous 1911 cotton crop, which was not gathered in some communities until late in March of this year, prohibited the children from attending school because their services were demanded to pick cotton.

Second district received \$497.23 from the state appropriation for term ending June 30, 1912. Under the graded school law, the following were established: one high school in the county, one middle school in the county, one primary school in the county, one primary school in the county.

Twenty-six white teachers were employed during the year. Their salaries aggregated \$33,229.40. The average salary for the white teachers was \$1274.21. The average salary for the negro teachers was \$731.00.

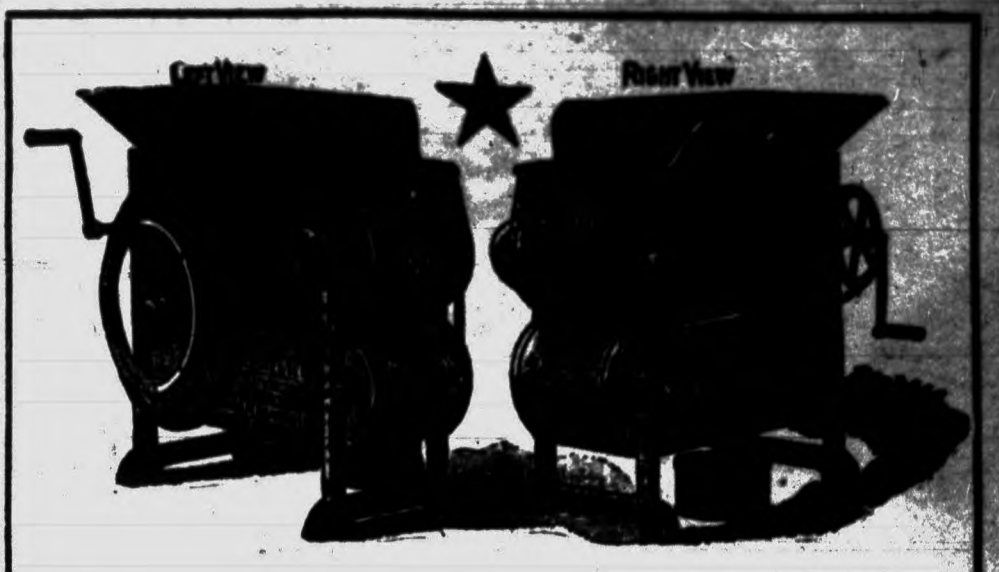
