Was A Most Disastrous Day.

Fire in Different Sections of the Country Result in Great Loss of Life and Property Sunday.

Aiken's Famous Hotel Burned.

A fire which started in the basement of the Hotel Park-in-the-Pines, Aiken's largest tourist hotel, at 11 o'clock Sunday morning, completely destroyed the structure and its contents, entailing a loss estimated at over \$300,000. Many of the guests had narrow escapes and heavy losses in a financial way. Practically nothing was saved from the burning building, so rapid was the spread of the flames. Two clerks saved the life of an 80-year-old New Yorker, who had to be lifted from his bed and carried to safety. Those who were rendered temporarily homeless by the fire are being cared for in the boarding houses and private homes of Aiken. Just fifteen years ago to the day the Hotel Park-in-the-Pines was burned in that little city. It is said that plans are afoot for the building of another hotel on this site.

\$1,500,000 Fire Loss at Savannah.

A fire which started in an old rice mill in Savannah, Ga., on an early hour Sunday morning did damage estimated at a million and a half dollars along the water front before the firemen were able to check the spread of the flame. There was no loss of life.

Lives Crushed out in Theatre Panic.

In a New York East Side moving picture show a panic was started Sunday night by a boy's cry of "fire" and the sight of smoke resulting from an exploded picture reel. In the rush for the exit, two women were trampled to death and eleven were so badly injured that they had to be carried to hospitals. There was only one exit beside the main entrance and it was in the latter place that the jam occurred and the eleven persons were injured. The two dead women were found in the main part of the theatre.

Four Killed in Sacramento.

An explosion of fumes of oil escaping from a defective burner in the basement of a Sacramento, Cal., apartment house early Sunday morning started a fire that completely destroyed the building, killed four persons, fatally injured another, while two are in hospitals suffering from burns and broken bones.
