

Aiken's Famous Hotel Burned.

A fire which started in the basement of the Hotel Park-in-the Pines, Aiken's largest tourist hotel, at 11 o'clock Sunday morning, completely destroyed the structure and its contents, entailing a loss estimated at over \$300,000. Many of the guests had narrow escapes and heavy losses in a financial way. Practically nothing was saved from the burning building, so rapid was the spread of the flames. Two clerks saved the life of an 80 year old New Yorker, who had to be lifted from his bed and carried to safety. Those who were rendered temporarily home less by the fire are being cared for in the boarding houses and private homes other hotel on this site.
