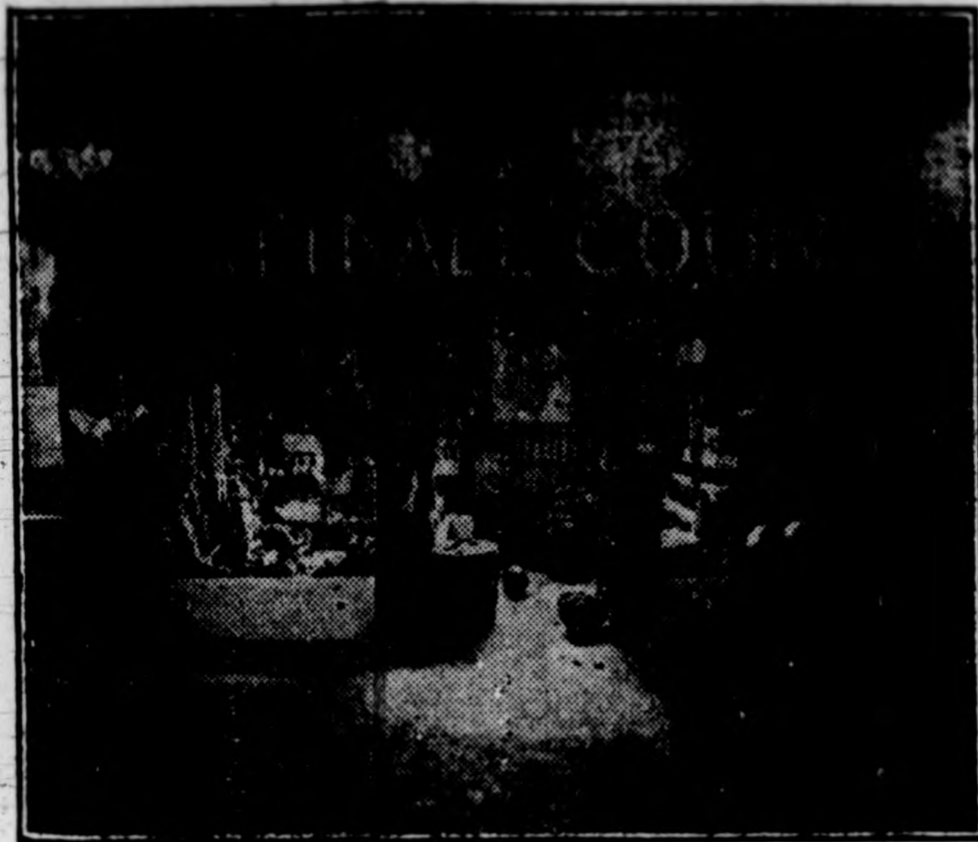

Cotton, corn, potatoes, preserved fruits, pumpkins, watermelons and even samples of the soil prepared in phials were there for the fair visitors to investigate.

October 27-November 3 is the period of the Tri-State Exposition this year. There will be a larger number of county booths than in the past because the inquiries from county agents give belief that fully half of one of the buildings will have to be set aside for the county work.

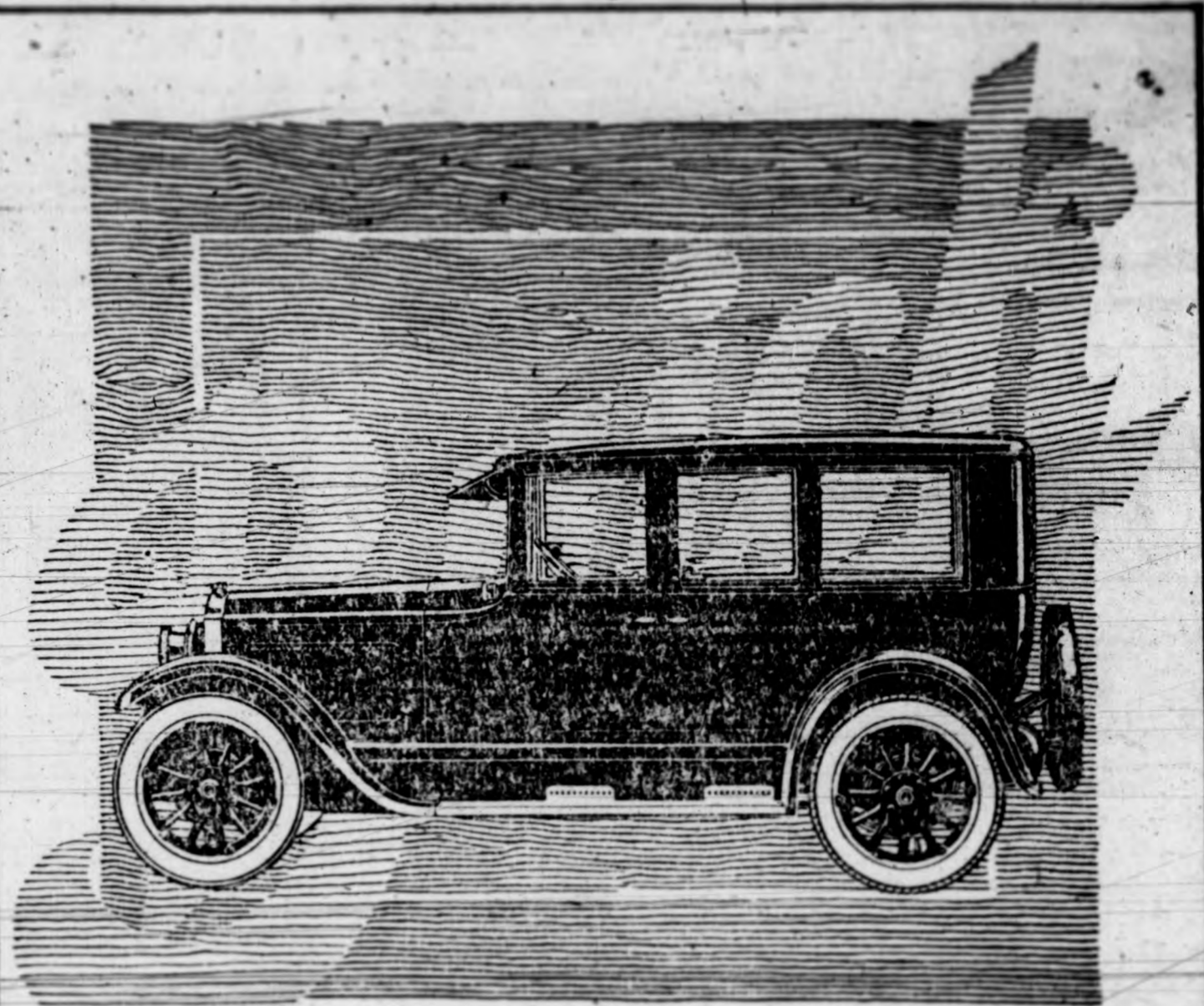
