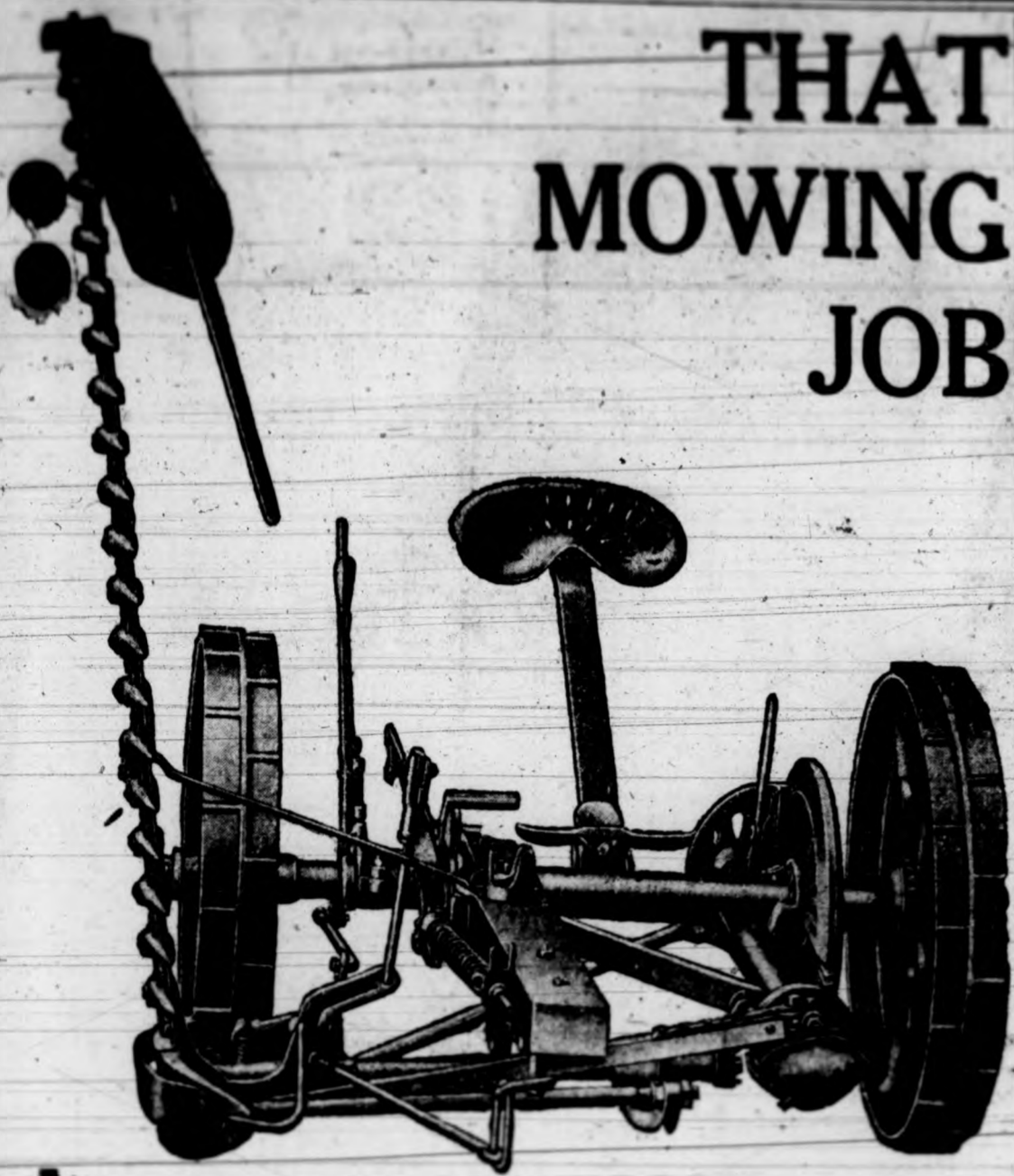


THAT MOWING JOB

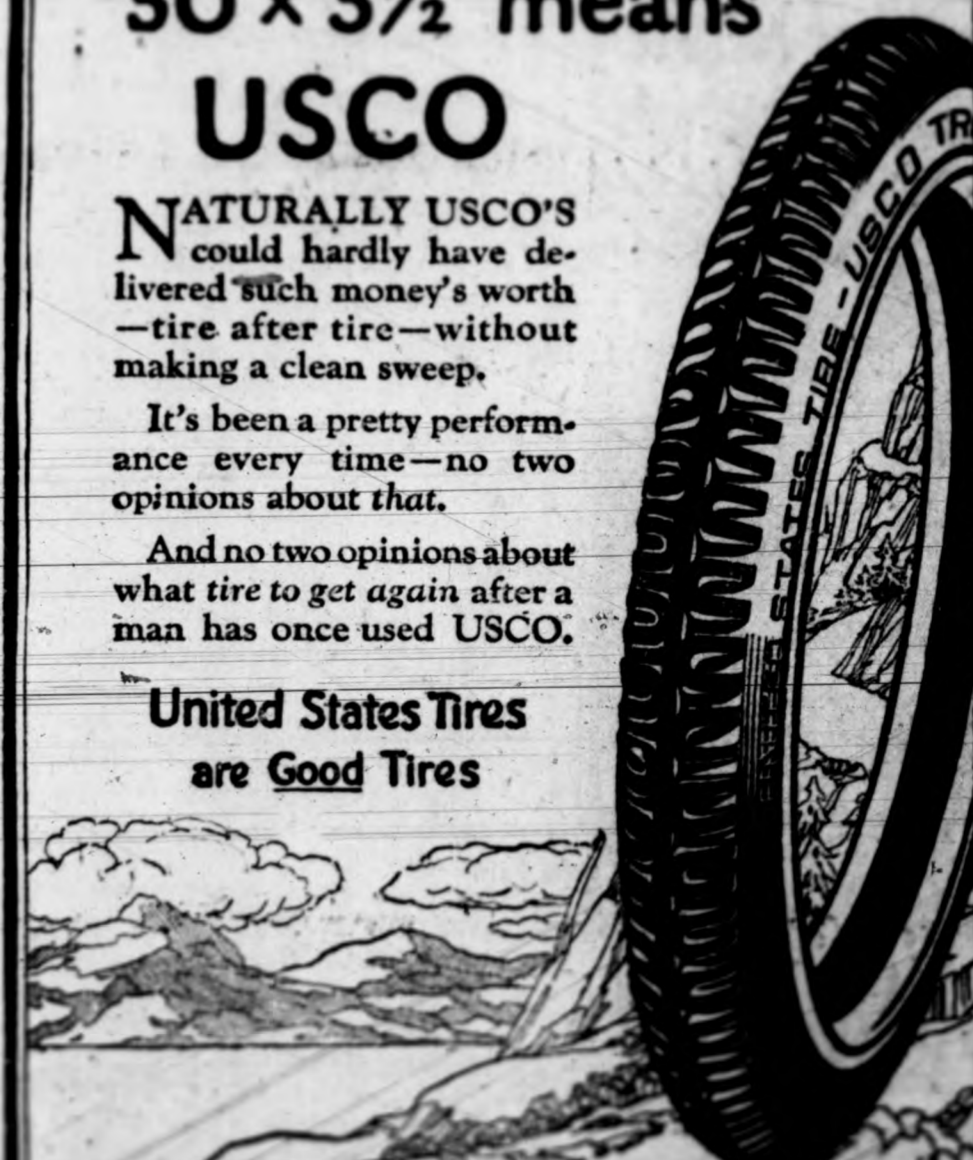
