

**SAVANNAH IS
PREPARING FOR
TRI-STATE EXPO.**

**WEEK OF OCTOBER 27-NO-
VEMBER 3 WILL SEE
GREATEST FAIR SEA-
SON THERE.**

With its improved facilities for handling some of the largest agricultural exhibits that have been seen in this section of the country, its race track that is being treated and kept in the best of condition, and the enlarged exhibit barns for cattle and swine, the Savannah Tri-State Exposition gives promise of presenting to the people of Georgia, Florida and South Carolina the best display of agricultural products, livestock, poultry and women's work that has been collected here since the inception of the present organization. The preparation that is now going on makes these things an absolute surety, and when the fair week, October 27-November 3, has arrived, Savannah will have on its outskirts the most modern fair in the state.

There are many things that will attract the attention of the farmers and others interested in agriculture at the Tri-State Exposition this season. So as to make the things of import to the agriculturist of first magnitude at the fair, plans have been made to double the space allotted to the county booths and it is hoped to set apart the greater part of one of the buildings for this purpose. The indication already is that there will be more than double the number of county booths at the fair than were there last year. The county work in Savannah's Zone is progressing on a large scale and the financial condition, and the production of the truck farms in this section is much better than in past years. This condition is extremely encouraging and the actual experience is that the number of county booths will not only be increased but the quality of the products will also be much improved.

In a general way the various departments will be well balanced, there being the best of exhibits in the livestock, poultry, swine, manufactures and art work divisions. This is partly due to the fact that the livestock section, which will be under the supervision of D. E. Sawyer, who had charge of the department last year. He is well known in Georgia as an authority of cattle, both beef and dairy, and his close contact with the conditions of feeding cattle in the three states makes him the logical man for the work. He has been in Savannah during the entire time of the Exposition last year and he made many acquisitions with the beef and dairy cattle breeders. The advantage of the Tri-State Exposition for the 1924 cattle show over other fairs of this section lies in the fact that there will not be another competing organization in operation in this territory during the week, October 27 to November 3. This condition makes the probability for holding the largest show with the most varied breeds extremely great. The other fairs of the state and in South Carolina will have closed their 1923 season several days before the Tri-State Exposition opens. The result will be that many breeds of cattle will be brought to Savannah from as far west as Canada and as far east as the Florida mountains.

For the same reason it is expected that the present buildings will be overtaxed as inquiries have been received from several breeders who desire to send lots with as many as twelve and fifteen heads. The variety will not be limited, practically every group being of a different breed. This makes the conditions for the exhibitor much more pleasant, and each owner will have a better opportunity to reap several prizes.
