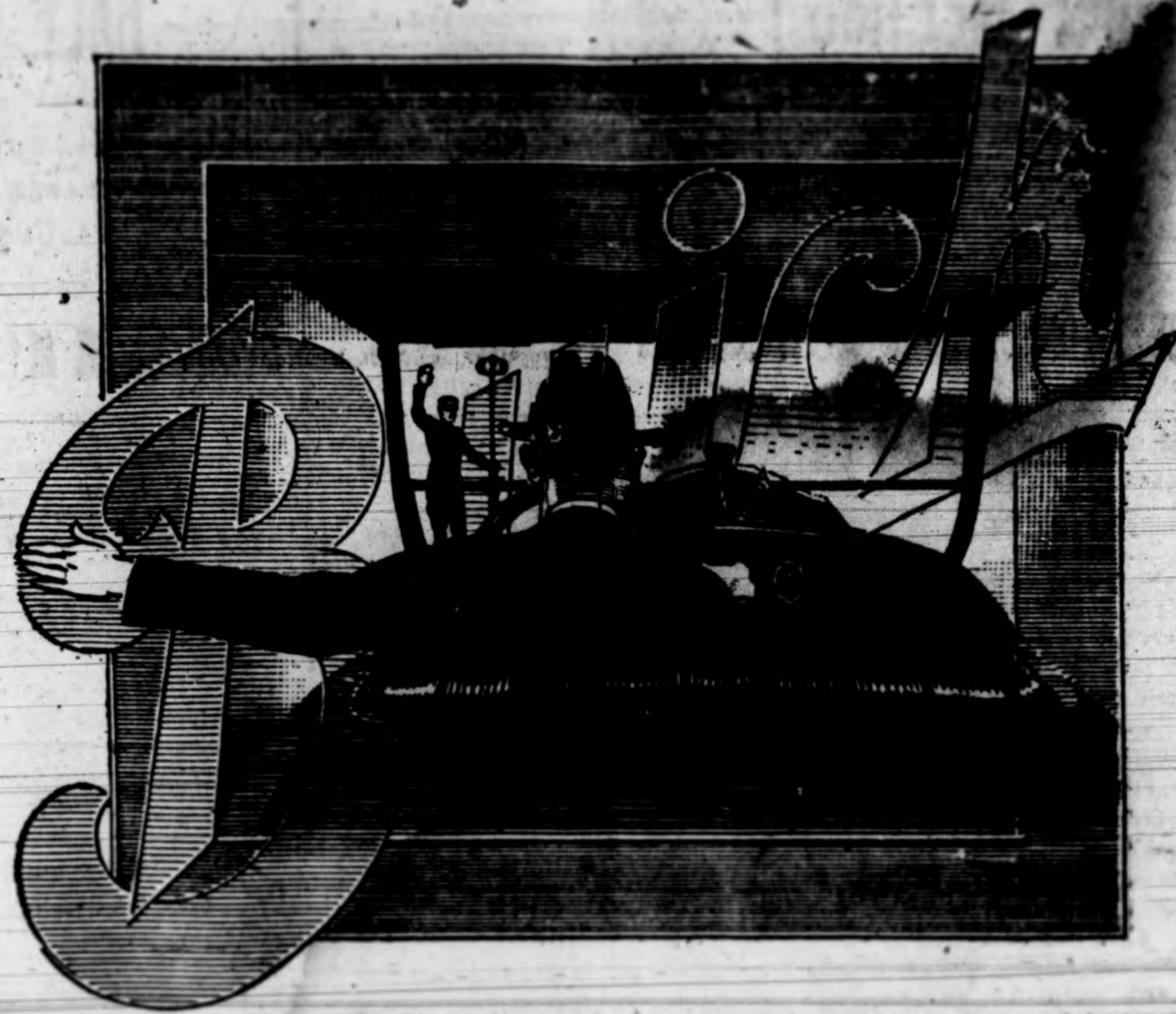
Mr. W. H. Hartzog, of Blackville route 2, was in the city yesterday (Wednesday) on business and while here put himself in good standing as a member of The People family.
