

**He Who Runs May Read.**

For information of farmers of Barnwell County, I submit the following:  
That sweet potato seed should be soaked 10 minutes in a solution of Formaldehyde, 1 pint to 30 gallons of water. This is very important and will assist in the control of the different diseases which rot the potatoes in the winter time. Formaldehyde may be bought at the different drug stores.  
That the best cotton seed to plant is good Cleveland Big Ball for non-wilt land, and for land that contains wilt or black root Dixie Triumph should be used.  
That good seed corn will increase the yield from 10 to 15 per cent. Be sure to get good selected corn seed to plant this year.  
That all watermelon, cucumber and cantaloupe seed should be treated before planting. Use 8 7 3-10 grain tablets of Bichloride of Mercury in

each gallon of water used, soak these seed for 10 minutes, then wash them five times in clear water, after which they may be planted wet or dry if the planting is not to be done immediately.  
Also if a farmer intends to grow good watermelons, cucumbers and cantaloupes it is first necessary that the seed should be treated as above outlined, and in addition to this, plans must be made to spray them thoroughly three times during the growing season, using a 4-1-50 blue stone, lime water solution. Information concerning the purchase of blue stone at a reasonable price, with purchase of suitable spray pumps for the application, and any other information concerning this important matter, will be furnished by
