

Post Office Outlines New Postal Rates Which Took Effect Tuesday

For the convenience of the public the Barnwell post office has listed in a short, concise manner the changes in postal rates that took place at midnight Tuesday.

These changes are listed by the postal authorities as follows:

First class matter (letters, etc.): Two cents per ounce. No change in rate.

Government postal cards: One cent each. No change in present rate.

Private mailing cards: Two cents each. This includes all private mailing cards, picture post cards, etc. which are approximately the size of a government postal card, whether they bear the words "Post Card," "Private Mailing Card," etc., or not. Large quotation or advertising cards entirely in print and which do not bear the words "Post Card," etc., will require 1 1/2 cents for each two ounces or fraction thereof.

Second class matter: Newspapers and magazines mailed by other than publishers or newsdealers will be two cents for each two ounces or fraction thereof. Over 8 ounces will take parcel post rates.

Third class matter includes everything formerly in the third and fourth classes such as printed matter, photographs, merchandise, etc., weighing not more than 8 ounces. The following rates will apply:

One ounce, 1 1/2 cents; 2 ounces, 1 1/2 cents; 3 ounces, 3 cents; 4 ounces, 3 cents; 5 ounces, 4 1/2 cents; 6 ounces, 4 1/2 cents; 7 ounces, 6 cents; 8 ounces, 6 cents.

Seeds, plants, roots, cuttings, books, catalogs, etc.: One cent for each two ounces up to eight ounces. Above 8 ounces takes parcel post rates.

Fourth class matter: Takes present parcel post rate plus 2 cents on each parcel. Everything weighing more than 8 ounces (except first class or letter mail) is included in fourth class or parcel post. The rate on parcel post will be the same as at present except a 2-cent service charge is added to every parcel of whatever size except those mailed on rural routes.

Special delivery fees: Letters and parcels weighing not more than two pounds, 10c fee; from 2 to 10 pounds, 15c fee; over 10 pounds, 20c fee.

Special handling: Parcels bearing 25 cents in stamps in addition to the regular postage and the words "Special Handling" will be accorded the same care in handling as first-class or letter mail.

Special attention is called to the following: "Mailable" perishables, such as meats, vegetables, fruits, flowers, etc., and in fact any other articles not otherwise provided for by law or regulation have, now, under the new law, the privilege of purchasing "Special handling" service together with "Special delivery" service, in case the mailers themselves consider the commodity which they are mailing justifies the expenditure. It is for them to decide. If the mailer decides not to purchase the special handling and special delivery stamps, his consignment will be handled as ordinary parcel post is customarily handled. The mailer having been informed by the postmaster as to his rights and privileges is the one to decide what service he will purchase.

Insurance fees: Values up to \$5, 5c fee; values up to \$25, eight cents fee; values up to \$50, 10c fee; values up to \$100, 25c fee.

C. O. D. fees: Charges up to \$10, 12c fee; charges up to \$25, 15c fee; charges up to \$100, 25c fee.

Registry fees: Value up to \$50, 15c fee; value up to \$100, 20c fee; articles for foreign countries, 10c fee.

Return receipts: A fee of 3 cents will be charged for a return receipt for either registered or insured mail to be paid by postage stamps attached to the parcel or letter.

Those who mail C. O. D. parcels will please take notice of the increased fees on the smaller money orders and prepare their C. O. D. tags accordingly.

REMINISCENCES

Of W. A. Gyles.

VIDETTE DUTY.

During the fighting of several days at Cold Harbor, Virginia, in the month of May, 1864, I was called upon or selected for "vidette duty," which is performed at night at an advanced post as near the enemy as possible, and are the only guard in front to avoid being surprised at night by the enemy "when the lines are near together, and you stay there all night alone at your post." Our instruction was "should you see or hear a body of troops advancing towards your position fire your gun and retreat back to the trenches and be sure of going in at the same place that you went out and under no consideration fire your gun without it is in actual self defense owing to a surprise attack by one man, which, sometimes happens. On this particular night our trenches were in a heavily timbered woods and on our left a swamp, and there was a shallow ditch leading out from our trenches in the direction of the enemy and I and another soldier accompanied by an officer went down the ditch and when we reached a large pine tree growing on the ditch bank, he told me this would be my post and he took good notice of the tree, which forked about ten feet from the ground and made two large trees easily distinguished at night from other trees as he had to return to me, and followed the ditch into our trenches as he could not get in any other way without great danger, then he went down to the swamp or near there to place the other man after telling me that he would not be gone more than ten or fifteen minutes and not to shoot him when he returned. Videttes did not halt any one only with a shot, and I kept looking and listening for the next two hours for his return, and I finally concluded that he had got lost and wandered into the enemy lines, and was captured or shot. After a long waiting I heard the breaking of dry twigs under the feet of a man or animal approaching in my direction, and concluded that I could not afford to let an enemy sneak up and capture or kill me and if killing had to be done I would rather have the start of the other fellow, so made ready for the fight by fastening on my bayonet, intending to fire to kill as soon as the man got near enough for me to see him distinctly. I was partly

I kept straining my eyes looking for the enemy and was somewhat worried because I was satisfied that the object was near enough for me to shoot, but could not see anything, and concluded it must be crawling, and cast my eyes down and there within five feet of me was the largest wild cat that I had ever seen, I could not shoot him as it would rouse the men from their slumbers, so I made a slight noise with my foot and then you should have heard and seen it

going. That animal frightened me more than a Yankee would have done as a man was what I was expecting to see.
Vidette duty is not very pleasant work, but I was often required to do that duty.
