### Bank Examiner to Court.

Columbia, April 15.—Quo warranto proceedings to oust B. J. Rhame from the office of State bank examiner have been brought by Attorney General Lyon and a rule to show cause has been issued against Rhame by the supreme court on April 19 why he should not vacate his office.

Legality of the appointees made by the governor in other cases will also come up at the same time. Proceedings were filed to-day in the Sandy Springs case against W. E. Green, magistrate at that place; S. E. Whitten, magistrate at Pendleton; W. T. Chamblee, at Rock Hill; J. A. Young, at Iva. The complaint in each case alleges that the appointments of these magistrates are illegal.

Proceedings were also filed at the same time to test the legality of the appointments in the Beaufort commissioners' case. They are J. W. White, of Hilton Head; A. L. Alexander, W. H. Stalworth, of Beaufort; C. F. Boineau, J. W. Campbell, B. Jesselson, of Sheldon; C. A. Verdier, J. R. Cooler, W. W. Hudson, of Bluffton; C. A. Walker, R. A. Coburn, S. S. Kellers, of Yemassee, all townships in Beaufort county. They were appointed by the governor without the recommendation of the delegation. The court is asked to adjudge them from office and to adjudge against them the cost of the proceedings together with such fines not to exceed \$2,000 as the court may deem best.

### Poison Ends Girl's Life.

Spartanburg, April 15.—Miss Bessie Atkins, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Atkins, of Holly Springs, drank a bottle of carbolic acid at her home Sunday afternoon and died in 15 minutes. The motive for the act is unknown. Her younger sister who came upon her when in the act of drinking the poison attempted to stay her hand, but in vain. The young woman was about 20 years of age. She has recently recovered from measles. No inquest was held.

## LIQUOR SEIZURES IN BAMBERG.

Seven Arrested, Charged with Selling Liquor.

Bamberg, April 14.—The blind tigers of Bamberg received quite a little shock early yesterday morning when Chief of Police Hand and his deputies pounced down upon them suddenly and unexpectedly. It was surmised by the officers that a full supply would be on hand for the Saturday trade, and that rich seizures would be made. But in this they were mistaken, or else the "tigers" were too cunning for the officers, for in some instances not "a drop of the stuff" was found on the premises and the largest seizure made netted only forty-five pints of beer and three half-pints of whiskey. This was obtained from Flernoid Smoak. From the premises of H. W. Beard about half a barrel of bottled beer was obtained, and from Josh Lott a keg of beer.

The following were arrested under warrants charging the illegal sale of whiskey: H. W. Beard, Josh Lott, Flernoid Smoak, B. Blume, Joe Robinson, T. D. Carter and Fred Gaskins.

The cases were worked up by E. F. Carter and F. C. Garner, who were sent here by Gov. Bleasie at the solicitation of Mayor Smoak. They came here about ten days ago and went to work as operatives in the cotton mill, and it was only about three days before they had worked up cases against the persons named above.

T. D. Carter has already pleaded guilty and received a fine of \$100 at the hands of the mayor. The other cases will be called Monday.

Mayor Smoak is making an honest effort to to enforce the law, but it looks as if his task is being a hopeless one, as liquor is being sold not only in the town but in country places as well. There appear to be few who are not disgusted with prohibition and if a vote were taken in this county at the present time there is little doubt that it would be overwhelmingly in favor of the re-establishment of the dispensary.

### Rome Druggist a Suicide.

Rome, Ga., April 16.—Albert Sidney Gresham, a prominent young man and partner in the Gresham-Wright Drug Company, of this city, committed suicide this morning by taking an over-dose of morphine. He is said to have left a note, which has not been made public. No cause for the act is known.
