

I MAKE THE ASSERTION THAT

AND BELOW PUBLISH THE RESULTS OF AN ABSOLUTE TEST

Mr. J. A. Graham, Overland Dealer at a small town in Texas, had occasion to have to drive a new OVERLAND from his distributer in order to have the car reach him in a certain time, and makes the following report:

"We took out of the stock of the Woodward Carriage Company, Overland Distributers of Southwest Texas, at San Antonio, a new OVERLAND, and looked the car over to see that it was in order. As we started from San Antonio, we decided we would find out how much gasoline it would take to go to Kingsville. We had the gasoline tank examined to see that it was filled. It was then sealed, and a certificate given us that we left San Antonio at 8:45, and that the gasoline tank was sealed there. We arrived at Kingville at 5:40 after a hard drive, against a strong wind all the way, and went at once to the Kingville Auto & Electric Company, and turned the OVERLAND and the San Antonio certificate over to them. They broke the seal on the gasoline tank, and drew out the remaining gas, and gave us the following certificate, the original of which we have in our office.

KINGSVILLE AUTO & ELECTRIC COMPANY

Kingsville, Texas, April 12, 1916.

Mr. J. A. Graham, San Benito, Texas.

This is to certify that at your request I broke the seal on the gasoline tank of the OVERLAND Car you drove into the garage today at 5:40 p. m., and measured the gasoline remaining in the tank on this OVERLAND. I drew out two and three-quarter gallons of gasoline, full measure, showing seven and one quarter gallons gasoline used in this tank, the same being a ten gallon tank. It is 174 miles from San Antonio to Kingsville, from which place you have just come today, according to certificate you turned over to me, which says you left there at 8:45 a. m., and that your gasoline tank was sealed there after having ten gallons put in it. This seal was intact on arrival here, so that the gasoline in this tank could not have been changed from San Antonio to Kingsville.
