Although the liquor interests tell us the consumption of whisky is constantly increasing notwithstanding the growing sentiment in favor of and the enactment of prohibitory laws, a good many liquor establishments have lately gone into bankruptcy. Prominent among the latest failures is the R. M. Rose company, well known locally. It is not likely that the whiskey houses are as prosperous as they once were.

It must be a pretty poor concoction when a fellow doesn't like to take his own medicine. The "reform" party has again protested to the war department for fear Bleasites may not be appointed on the exemption boards. The former governor says the Bleasites will not be represented except in a few instances. It would appear that Mr. Blease's only criticism of the governor should be that any but his friends were appointed at all.

The Herald is today at the expense of considerable space publishing the complete list of persons registering in Bamberg county for the selective draft. The lists of both white and colored are printed for the information of the public. These young men have enrolled for service in the army, and their friends and acquaintances are entitled to know that they have complied with the law. The public should also know if there are any who have failed to register, thus increasing the burden of those who have registered. A copy of this list is available to all newspapers, but it is only here and there that newspapers are found that are willing to incur the labor and expense of printing the lists. The published list will furnish a permanent record for future use, and we think it would be a good idea for every family represented in the rolls to keep this issue of The Herald.

To show what a newspaper means to a community, it is only necessary to point to one instance, the planting of velvet beans. Two or three years ago there were not a half a dozen farmers in the county who had ever seen a velvet bean. This year there are thousands of acres. The department of agriculture sent salaried men to talk boll weevil and velvet beans to the farmers of the county. A handful of men attended the meetings—most of whom never operated a farm in their lives and who never expect to. The Bamberg Herald gave column after column to this important matter; we left out much other local and general matter to do so. It was the only paper in Bamberg county to give anything beyond passing mention to the planting of velvet beans. The government men gave the facts and figures, but The Herald carried them to the farms of the county. The same thing can be said of growing wheat three years ago. The Herald, of course, asks for no special credit in doing this. We run a newspaper, and we do not mind going to any reasonable expense to give the news to our readers.

It is proposed, according to Washington dispatches, to list news print paper as non-essential. In other words during this emergency the publication of newspapers is not to be considered essential to the successful conduct of the war. We get some new surprises from Washington very often now—but this beats them all. After all the newspapers have done and are doing every day to help this government . . . this is the thanks they get. Newspapers have never been treated with any consideration by the government, however, so it is really nothing new, after all. How the government expects to get its free advertising—in the event the newspapers have to suspend, which, of course, won't happen—is a mystery. It really looks like whenever a congressman or senator runs shy of publicity, he takes a whack at the newspapers. With all the cussing, however, none of them—the government nor any of its employees or representatives—fail to ask free favors of the newspapers. Anybody who does not recognize the absolute necessity of newspapers in the conduct of the war or even the conduct of the government itself is simply an ignoramus and it would be a waste of words to argue with such a person.
