WATCH OUT FOR THEM.

Counterfeit Stamp Has Washington's Head Too Short.

Counterfeits of the familiar two-cent postage stamps have appeared for the first time since 1895. One of the new counterfeits came into the hands of a collector today, says a New York dispatch recently. It is an engraving—the first on record. Two spurious issues of twenty-seven years ago were typographed.

To the casual glance the new counterfeit seems familiar enough, but comparative examination quickly exposes poor workmanship and reveals many points of variance from the original. Washington's head is shorter, the nose has a hook, the eyes seem to glance furtively to the side instead of straight ahead.

The paper of the counterfeit is cheaper and thinner and the perforations number 12 instead of 11 every two centimeters.

The treasurer's office will be open for the collection of State, county, school and all other taxes from the 15th day of October, 1921, until the 15th day of March, 1922, inclusive.

From the first day of January, 1922, until the 31st day of January, 1922, a penalty of 1 per cent. will be added to all unpaid taxes. From the first day of February, 1922, until the 28th day of February, 1922, a penalty of 2 per cent. will be added to all unpaid taxes. From the first day of March, 1922, until the 15th day of March, 1922, a penalty of 7 per cent. will be added to all unpaid taxes.

All persons between the ages of 21 and 60 years, except Confederate soldiers and sailors, who are exempt at 50 years, are liable to a poll tax of \$1.00.

Capitation dog tax, \$1.25.
All male persons who were 21 years of age on or before the first day of January, 1921, are liable to a poll tax of \$1, and all who have not made returns to the auditor are requested to do so on or before the first day of January, 1922, and thereby save penalty and costs.
I will receive the commutation road tax of four (\$4.00) dollars from the 15th day of October, 1921, to the 15th day of March, 1922.

In addition to the above levies there is a three mill levy for drainage on all property in the town of Bamberg and some of the surrounding territory.

ASSESSMENT NOTICE.

For the convenience of those living in different sections of the county, the auditor or his deputy will be at the following places on the days and dates mentioned for the purpose of taking returns of real and personal property, and all taxpayers are urged to make a list of everything they are to return. On account of real estate being returned again for 1922, I would suggest that each taxpayer owning land find out just how many acres he has of taxable land, number of acres of wood land, and number of acres of swamp land. That will enable the board of assessors to get at the valuation more accurate, and the land owner will not have to pay as much for inferior land as he pays for lands that he is cultivating. In order that no mistake will be made try and make your own return.

Snowstorms will cancel any of the above dates, which will be provided later.

Each taxpayer is requested to find out what township and school district he resides in.

All returns sent in by mail should be written with ink, and sworn to before some notary public.

All male persons between the ages of 21 and 60 (except Confederate veterans and sailors, who are exempt at 50) are liable to a poll tax of \$1.00. All able-bodied male persons between the ages of 21 and 55 are liable to the commutation road tax of \$4.00, except those living in an incorporated town.

The time for making returns is from January 1, 1922, to February 20, 1922. After the 20th of February the 50 per cent. penalty will be added to all returns not made.

NOTICE CONCERNING PLOWING IN PUBLIC ROADS.

Pursuant to recommendation of the Bamberg County Grand Jury, the landowners of the county cultivating lands adjacent and adjoining public roads are hereby urgently requested not to plow into or allow their hands to plow into the roads. Landowners are requested to plant two or three rows of crops adjacent to roads parallel with the road, so that there may be proper turning space without the necessity of turning plows in the roads. It is against the law to allow plows to damage the roads, and it is an unnecessary practice. The county spends large sums of money in road building, and the roads belong to the people. I have no desire to prosecute anybody, but I must insist that this practice be stopped immediately. The farmers and tenants can cooperate in this respect, and there should be no necessity to bring action against anybody. Full notice is being given before I take such action.

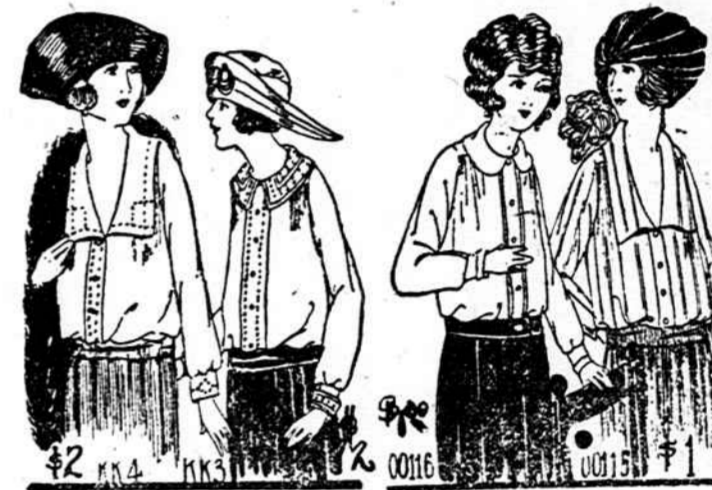
