Columbia, S. C., Jan. 6.—Nothing can be learned here regarding the alleged loss of \$18,000 from an express package enroute between Augusta, Ga., and New York. J. F. Chattanooga, Tenn., Jan. 6.—J. E. P. Gould, a leading physician of this city was found in his room this morning in a very serious condition. Some time yesterday he cut his throat with a surgical instrument, barely missing the jugular vein, and got into his bed and lay in his blood until his room was broken open by friends.

**Think Schooner Is Lost.**  
Mobile, Ala., Jan. 6.—The owners in this city of the Norwegian schooner Laguna, which sailed from Moss Point, Miss., on Sept. 11, with a cargo of lumber for Colon, Panama, have given her up for lost. She was in command of Captain Otto Gronneberg, and carried a crew of nine men.

**Conditions Are Satisfactory.**  
Manila, Jan. 6.—A local paper printed dispatches from San Francisco yesterday stating troops were to be sent to quell a possible uprising of natives. Both the military and civil officials say the conditions were never better and that troops can be withdrawn from the islands without danger.

**Prominent Theologian Dead.**  
San Francisco, Jan. 6.—The Rev. John S. McIntosh, president of the San Francisco Theological College, is dead at St. Elmo of heart failure, aged 65 years. He was one of the organizers of the university extension movement in America.

Noted Trial Conducted by Government Comes to Close.

Greensboro, N. C., Jan. 6.—The noted trial of the case of the United States against A. S. Patterson, charged with making false entries in his expense account has been concluded in the federal court when Judge Boyd completed his charge, placed the case in the hands of the jury, saw them filed out of court and ordered an adjournment, having instructed the clerk to take verdict should the jury come to a conclusion.

In exactly twenty minutes the jury returned to the court room, and in response to the usual question, Clerk Trogden responded:

"We find the defendant guilty."

Able counsel had made powerful appeals to those twelve men. On the part of the government, two of its representatives, District Attorney Holton and Assistant Attorney Price had presented the side of the prosecution with great force and effect. For the defendant two of the recognized most powerful and convincing pleaders in criminal trials in North Carolina, ex-Governor Aycock and Hon. Cyrus B. Watson, made the opening and concluding appeals for the defendant.

**ANTI-TOXIN STAVED DEATH.**

**New Treatment Brings Life Back to Little Boy.**

Atlanta, Jan. 6.—Death seemed to have already set his seal upon little William Pittman when the wonderful new tetanic anti-toxin was administered to him. Physicians standing by him announced that the little was lost to them, and won by the grim and terrible disease.

But the tiny spark of life that yet remained in the boy's body was fanned by artificial respiration, and the anti-toxin triumphed. That was Thursday night, and Friday the child was said to have an excellent chance to recover.

The successful treatment of this and two other cases of tetanus in Atlanta within the past two weeks is attracting widespread attention, the first case being already practically a complete recovery. All three were the results of wounds from blank cartridges, fired from toy pistols.

The anti-toxin treatment used to combat the disease is an innovation in the practice of medicine, though its use has been known to some extent in New York. Until it was inaugurated, the percentage of recoveries from tetanus, or lockjaw, where the disease developed within five days after the wound was received, was only one or two, and in cases where the disease manifested itself in from five to ten days, the percentage of recoveries had been only two or three.

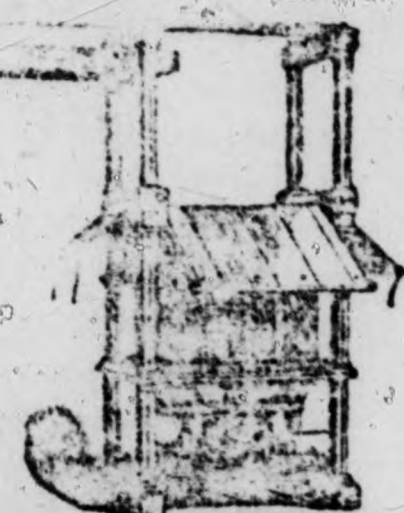
