Miller took the ball from a Harbison carrier in the third quarter and with magnificent blocking, dashed 85 yards for the game's first tally. Ernest King cracked off right tackle for the extra point.

The final tally came shortly after the final period opened with Fair passing to Miller, the latter galloping 40 yards to score. A pass, Fair to Harris, made the extra point good.

Republican Leader Blasts Opponents

An enthusiastic audience greeted J. Bates Gerald, and applauded often as the Republican candidate for the U. S. Senate and chairman of the S. C. Republican party, championed the National Republican party platform, lambasted the Dixiecrats and the Democratic Party and scored Governor J. Strom Thurmond for refusal to allow the people a secret ballot, here Monday night.

The meeting was held in Union Baptist Church and the speaker intimated that although the legislature had been requested to pass on the secret ballot to the people, such bills did not come to the floor of the legislature because of deliberate strategy which stymied the effort.

SCORERS THURMOND
"Although I would hate like the devil to have my name appear on a secret ballot with those grand mammals in the Dixiecratic party," Mr. Gerald declared, "I know that the people of this state, like those of every other state in the Union, should have the unrestricted privilege of voting their convictions."

"Thurmond should not withhold from South Carolinians what he seeks for himself in other states, the GOP chieftain avowed.

Gerald also poked at Democratic incumbent U. S. Senator Burnet R. Maybank, his opponent in the gen-

eral election, for appearing in Georgia to speak while seeking office in South Carolina.

Various pamphlets, Dewey-Warren buttons and ballots were distributed. Instructions as to balloting were given and all were urged to go to the polls on November 2. 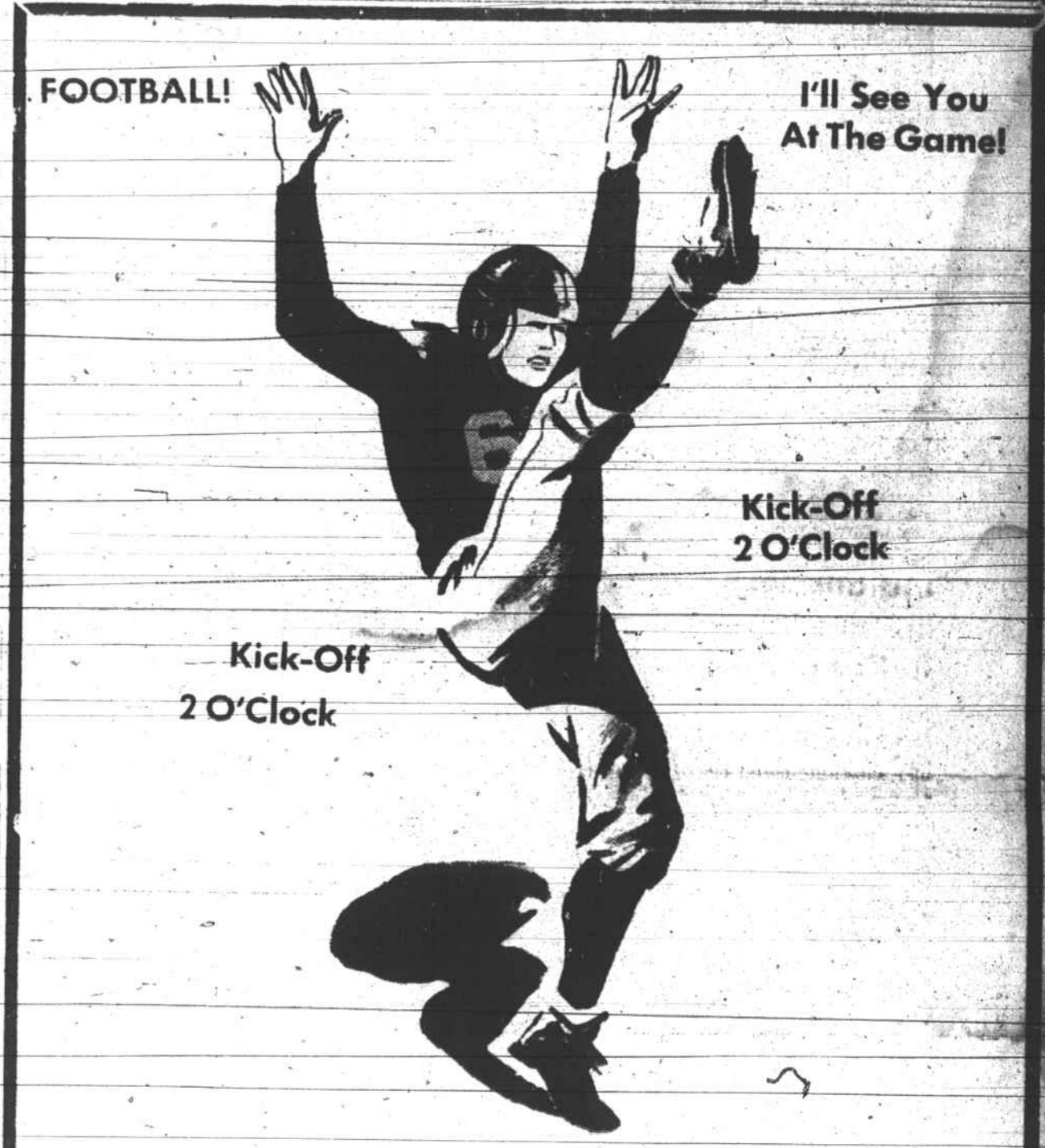
