**Unbeaten State College Meets Morris Brown**

 ORANGEBURG—Unbeaten in three games, the S. C. State A. and M. Bulldogs are preparing to meet unbeaten Morris Brown Wolverines of Atlanta, who have been unbeaten in five games, on Saturday, November 3, at 2:15 p. m. in State College stadium. Both teams hope to win this week to keep their unbeaten untied record.  
 The next home game promises to attract a record attendance, perhaps the largest ever in the stadium.  
 Morris Brown, in five season games, is unbeaten and untied and has beaten Florida A & M College, national and Southern Conference champion for several years.  
 The Bulldogs, under a new mentor, Lawrence Simmons, are in the race with two other teams now, Xavier and Morris Brown, for conference honors and so far are the undefeated team in the conference.  
 Coach Simmons is working to smooth out the defects in offensive blocking and passing with his freshmen cohort, in order to be ready for the powerful Wolverines, who are under the tutelage for the third year of Coach "Ox" Clemmons.  
 Coach Simmons will be depending upon the following Bulldogs on defense, who have been outstanding this season: Eugene Holt, a junior, of Orlando, Fla., and Roderick Johnson, freshman, of East St. Louis, Ill. both fine backers; in the line, William Senior, a senior of Tampa Fla., at tackle and George Robinson, sophomore, of Orlando, Fla., at guard.  
 Lamont C. Brown, Nashville, Tenn., a promising freshman at guard, has also received high praises from Coach Simmons for the season's showing.  
 On offense much credit goes to Claude (Bull) Martin, offensive fullback, of Pulaski, Tenn., who scored two touchdowns and gained 109 yards on twelve plays in Saturday's game against Fort Valley and also Samuel Parks, halfback of Canton, Ohio, a consistent ground gainer, who chalked up 112 yards in 12 plays.  
 Two quarterbacks came in for high praise, namely, Thomas Humber, Columbus, Ga., triple-threat player, who has kicked 8 extra points, in this season's play and chalked up 3 touchdowns and Clifford Turner, East St. Louis, Ill. who substituted Saturday and got the team moving smoothly after Humber was hurt.
