GREENSBORO, N. C.—The A & T College Aggies, defending 1951 C.I.A.A. Baseball champions are in for a "rough battle" to retain the title this year according to Felix Harris, baseball coach at the college. "In spite of the fact that we had 66 players to report for the initial practice, the gaping holes in our pitching staff and outfield caused by graduation just can't be filled by freshmen," continued the coach.

He had in mind vacant positions he has to fill in the outfield formerly occupied by Howard Rouse and Robert Park Smith, both of whom graduated last year and are now playing with "A" class teams in organized baseball. His chief worry was on the subject of pitchers. Ernest Canada who won 5 and lost one and Edward Martin with a 6 win and no loss record, both playing with the Philadelphia Stars, are not around this year.

The pitching staff starts off with a nucleus including veterans, Raymond Johnson, 2-0; Lionel Jackson 1-2 and Eugene Tapscott, 1-0, whose records are not so poor. "But experience is very important and these fellows haven't had enough," chimed in Coach Harris.
