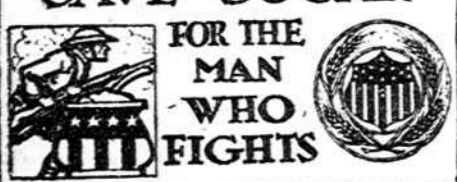

This is the year for all voters who expect to participate in the November general election to re-register. The county board of registration for Lexington, Ben F. Derrick chairman; J. Weir Addy, and W. B. **SUGAR AND TOBACCO BURNED.**

An Atlantic Port, Sept. 5.—An American steamship caught fire at sea and came into port today with a hold in flames, which had been burning 60 hours, destroying thousands of pounds of sugar, tobacco and fruits taken on at Portorica.

**ABUSE OF GOVERNMENT ALLOWANCES.**

Columbia, September 6.—Reports have reached the State Council of Defense from several parts of the State of abuse of government allowances, which in some instances are being received by persons who are not entitled to such allowances. Under the law, allowances are paid only to legal dependents of men in the military or naval service. Any persons receiving such government aid, under false pretences, are liable to prosecution.

The Defense Council is instructing the county chairman throughout the State to investigate into this important matter, and calls upon its membership and the public to aid in this work.

It is urged that all cases of abuse as may be detected be reported promptly to the county chairman of the Council of Defense in the county in which the person receiving an allowance to which he or she is not entitled resides. The county chairman will then report the case to the State Council, and action will be taken, through proper channels, to correct this evil.

**NO LOAFING IN ATLANTA: ITS WORK OR FIGHT.**

Atlanta, Sept. 6.—Although Atlanta streets may be extremely dangerous because of the loose enforcement of automobile traffic laws, the local police department is not going to allow any loafers to adorn the sidewalks or clutter the pool rooms in violation of the work or fight law enacted at the session of the legislature recently adjourned.

Provisions of the act were read to each of the three watches of the police department yesterday, and the men were given strict instructions to arrest every man between the ages of 16 and 55 years who is not engaged in a useful and productive occupation for at least five and one-half days a week. The fact that a man of this age may have real estate which brings him an income, or money in the bank or other means of a livelihood without work, does not excuse him from the provisions of the law.
