Bethune, January 11. Raley's Mill, January 12. Bowers' School House, January 13 Kirkley's Store, January 11. Kershaw, January 15 and 16. Westville, January 18. Russell Place, January 19.

Liberty Hill, January 20. Blancy, January 21. The law requires that all persons owning property or in anywise having

charge of such property either as agent, husband, guardiso, trustee. executor, administrator, &c., return the same under oath to the Auditor. who requests all persons to be prompt in making their returns and save the 50 per cent penalty which will be added to the property valuation of all persons who fail to make returns within the time prescribed by law.

INCOME TAX Under an Act of the Legislature att persons having a grass income of Twenty-five Handred Dollars or more are required to make a return of the same to the Auditor at the same time of making their other returns.

All returns sent by mail noist be made out on proper blanks and sworn to before some officer qualified to administer said oath, otherwise they will not be received at this office as re-




