

AN ORDINANCE

o prevent and punish the practice of Gaming and Gambling in the Town of Bennettsville.

Be it Ordained by the Town Council of ennettsville, in regular meeting assembled Sec. 1. That the playing of any game with cards or dice, raffling, crackaloo, and any and all other games of chance in any public place, store, house or office within the corporate limits of said town is hereby prohibited.

Sec. 2. That any person violating this ordinance, upon conviction, shall be fixed not less than One Dollar, nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or be imprisoned in the county Jail not less than ten nor more than 30 days. One half of the fine collected in any case to be paid to the informer, except in the case of the Marshal, whose official duty it shall be to enforce the prorisions of this Ordinance.

Take notice, that matching for cool drink tickets, segars, or anything else, is a violation of above Ordinauco, and the same with all other provisions will be en-
