The South Carolina College for Teachers.

Althrigh nearly approaching its contennal abiliversary, the South Cavelina College shows none of the decrepting of vigorous life. A new departure of great importance to the College and to the Etate has just been mangirated. For some years the College has had a department of pedagogy, for the training of teachers, but last winter, for the first time, the Legislature created a mimber of endowed normal scholarships, one for each county. It is the intention of the Trustees and Faculty to set these scholarships upon a high plane, and to seek thereby to qualify superfor young men for positions of leadership and influence in our public schools. However largely women may be employed as teachers, the work of superintendence, direction and control unset continue to be most largely in the hands of the men; and it is to supply these teachers of leadership and influence in the community as well as in the schools, that the College will chiefly sim, through these scholarships. 
