J., Griffith, of Columbia, He has on each farm 300 acres in catton and it is a sale calculation and is postively stated that without a mishap to the crop, he will gather 600 balee of 500 pounds each. This visitor has traveled considerably throughout the State and is a very large planter himself, hls principal topic of conversaiion being crops, which he admires the beauty of almost equal to tair women—both being productions of Nature—and asserts that, without exception, this farm is a paragrap of excellence beyond, compare with any in the ception, this farm is a paragon of excellence beyond compare with any in the

Aside from the fact that the cotton is generally so very good, there is a 40 acre field on the DeSaussure side on which a special test was made with "Peruvian guano," Previous to this year it has been impossible to produce any crop that would make a satisfactory yield on this land, it hardly paying to plant cotton on it; being light soil and full of nut grass. They used in producing the handsome crop this year 400 pounds Peruvian guano under the cotton and 200 around crop. This 40 acres of cotton held its color well, dark green, all during the hot dry spell of May and greater part of June and as soon as rain commenced it shot out, and has grown beyond expectation—it is loaded with fruit, and is the handsomest piece of cotton on that farm and 2,000 pounds of seed cotton to the acre will be a conservative estimate of the yield

On the adjoining farm there is the same size tract—though better land—where only 400 pounds Peruvian guano was used and it is sale to estimate an equal yield on this 40 acres. This is also as fine a piece of cotton as can be shown on

either farm.
