SHOT TO DEATH.

Eight Prisoners Lined Up and Riddled With Bullets BY DETERMINED MOB.

One of the Victims Was a White Man, Whom a Citizen and the County Jailor Begged the Mob to Spare, but it Refused to Do So.

A mob entered the jail at Watkinsonville, Ga., at two o'clock Thursday morning and took therefrom nine prisoners, eight of whom were shot to death and the ninth escaped only by being thrown from the top of the jail.

A dispatch from Lodi says that General Marmuscio, commander of the troops at Lodi, was assassinated. The general while he was driving through the city and after dragging him from his carriage stabbed him through his heart.
